Apostles Creed:

Scripture Reading: Psm. 32

The psalmist connects honesty before God with freedom and joy. What keeps you from being honest with God about sin, guilt, or failure—and how does this psalm challenge those barriers?

Scripture Reading: Job 13:13-19

Job boldly declares his willingness to speak honestly before God, even if it costs him everything. What does this passage teach us about faithful honesty with God in times of suffering, and how does it challenge the way we usually pray or speak about our pain?

Scripture Reading: Phi. 1:21-30

Paul writes a compelling letter to the church in Philippi. What does it practically look like to “live worthy of the gospel of Christ” (v. 27) in our current cultural context?
