Apostles Creed:

**I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit
and born of the virgin Mary.**

**He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to hell.**

The third day he rose again from the dead.

**He ascended to heaven
and is seated at the right hand of God the Father
almighty.**

**From there he will come to judge the living and
the dead.**

the forgiveness of sins,

Prayer of Confession:

Scripture Reading: Psm. 17:1-15

Scripture Reading: Songs 5:9-6:3

What does this passage teach us about articulating love—whether in relationships or in faith—and how does remembering who and whose we are shape our perseverance during seasons of distance, doubt, or longing?

Scripture Reading: 1 Cor. 15:1-11

Why do you think Paul stresses both the shared tradition and personal experience of the resurrection, and how does returning to what is “of first importance” shape our faith when doubts or distractions arise?
