Friday, March 26, 2021

Psalm 118:1-2, 19-24 - A Song of Victory

1 O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his steadfast love endures forever! 2 Let Israel say, "His steadfast love endures forever."

19 Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the Lord. 20 This is the gate of the Lord; the righteous shall enter through it. 21 I thank you that you have answered me and have become my salvation. 22 The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. 23 This is the Lord's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes.

24 This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.

Notes and Prayer

As you pray the Psalm you may remember being taught the song - This Is the Day - you know you want to sing it. If you don't remember there are a variety of versions on Youtube.

Saturday, March 27, 2021

Mark 10:46-52 - The Healing of Blind Bartimaeus

46 They came to Jericho. As he and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus son of Timaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting by the roadside. 47 When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" 48 Many sternly ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" 49 Jesus stood still and said, "Call him here." And they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take heart; get up, he is calling you." 50 So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. 51 Then Jesus said to him, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man said to him, "My teacher, let me see again." 52 Jesus said to him, "Go; your faith has made you well." Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way.

Notes

Put yourself in the story. Pick a character. What do you see, hear, taste, touch, smell? What is like sternly order Bartimaeus to be quiet? To be Jesus and here the desperate call of a blind beggar? To be blind and then to see?

Prayer

Lord, open my eyes, heal my spiritual blindness, let me see what only you can help me see.



Daily Devotional Readings for the week of March 22 – March 27, 2021

Monday, March 22, 2021

Psalm 119:9-16

9 How can young people keep their way pure? By guarding it according to your word.

10 With my whole heart I seek you; do not let me stray from your commandments.

11 I treasure your word in my heart, so that I may not sin against you.

- 12 Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes.
- 13 With my lips I declare all the ordinances of your mouth.
- 14 I delight in the way of your decrees as much as in all riches.
- 15 I will meditate on your precepts, and fix my eyes on your ways.
- 16 I will delight in your statutes; I will not forget your word.

Notes

Purity is important. How do you guard it according to God's word? Do as the Psalmist says. Seeking God with your whole heart and you will find that God's words are invaluable.

Think back over the last 6 months how often did you typically spend time by yourself reading and reflecting on scripture? Rarely - Less than weekly - 1-3 times per week - 4-6 times per week - Every day? How do you want to answer that question 6 months from now?

Prayer

Pray the prayer. Many of the Psalms are words of aspiration. We say it and do it until we become it.

Tuesday, March 23, 2021

Isaiah 44:1-8 - God's Blessing on Israel

44 But now hear, O Jacob my servant, Israel whom I have chosen!
2 Thus says the Lord who made you, who formed you in the womb and will help you: Do not fear, O Jacob my servant, Jeshurun whom I have chosen.
3 For I will pour water on the thirsty land, and streams on the dry ground;
I will pour my spirit upon your descendants, and my blessing on your offspring.
4 They shall spring up like a green tamarisk, like willows by flowing streams.
5 This one will say, "I am the Lord's," another will be called by the name of Jacob, yet another will write on the hand, "The Lord's," and adopt the name of Israel.
6 Thus says the Lord, the King of Israel, and his Redeemer, the Lord of hosts:
I am the first and I am the last; besides me there is no god.

7 Who is like me? Let them proclaim it, let them declare and set it forth before me. Who has announced from of old the things to come? Let them tell us what is yet to be. 8 Do not fear, or be afraid; have I not told you from of old and declared it? You are my witnesses! Is there any god besides me? There is no other rock; I know not one.

Notes and Prayer

Consider what Isaiah is saying about God's nature and relationship with the people. Chosen, formed in the womb, poured out blessings.

Pray the Psalm substituting your name for Jacob, Israel, Jeshuran.



"From Easter to Pentecost: The Emerging Church in Toxic Times"

Beginning on Wednesday, April 14th and concluding on Wednesday May 12th, Pastor Ed Zeiders will lead **Part One** of the study and will explore the early chapters of the Book of Acts. Wednesday, March 24, 2021

John 12:44-50 - Summary of Jesus' Teaching

44 Then Jesus cried aloud: "Whoever believes in me believes not in me but in him who sent me. 45 And whoever sees me sees him who sent me. 46 I have come as light into the world, so that everyone who believes in me should not remain in the darkness. 47 I do not judge anyone who hears my words and does not keep them, for I came not to judge the world, but to save the world. 48 The one who rejects me and does not receive my word has a judge; on the last day the word that I have spoken will serve as judge, 49 for I have not spoken on my own, but the Father who sent me has himself given me a commandment about what to say and what to speak. 50 And I know that his commandment is eternal life. What I speak, therefore, I speak just as the Father has told me."

Notes

It is interesting to note that Jesus did not come to judge the world but to save it. It is the Word that comes from God that is the judge. How does that work? Choose to believe, choose light or you are choosing darkness. Maybe the final judgment is simply an acknowledgment of your choice - do you choose to live in relationship with God living God's way or choose not to. Either way there is a place for you in your choice.

Prayer

Lord, I want to know and keep your words. They are light and life for me and for eternity.

Thursday, March 25, 2021

Philippians 2:1-11 - Imitating Christ's Humility

2 If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, 2 make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. 3 Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. 4 Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. 5 Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, 7 but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, 8 he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross. 9 Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, 10 so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Notes and Prayer

This is put in verse form because it is actually an early hymn of the church. The Greek word "kenosis" or "self-emptying" is used in verse 7. When we empty ourselves of personal or selfish concerns as described in vss. 3 and 4 we make room to be filled entirely with God's divine will. Prayerfully read the hymn several times. What do you need to self-empty? Allowing the space, how has God filled you?
