Tuesday - John 14:1-3

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me.² In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? ³ And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also.

"For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God." Paul in Colossians 3:3

Notes – Moment by moment we have a choice. Do we trust ourselves or others for our health, wholeness, peace, and productivity, or do we trust God by placing our trust in Jesus Christ? God, who made you, and Jesus Christ, who died to free you, are trustworthy. Having died and risen with Christ our dwelling place is in God where no one can touch our true life.

Prayer – Lord, when others attack me, blame me, shame me, try to tear me down, remind me to trust you and to remember that if I dwell in your unconditional love that no one can take away.

Wednesday - Psalm 56:1-3

3 When I am afraid, I put my trust in you. ¹ Be gracious to me, O God, for people trample on me; all day long foes oppress me; ² my enemies trample on me all day long, for many fight against me. O Most High, ³ when I am afraid, I put my trust in you. ⁴ In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust; I am not afraid; what can flesh do to me?

Notes – The writer is frightened by enemies and makes a conscious decision to trust God. Despite the fact that all crime, particularly violent crime, has fallen to almost half of the crime rates of the 1990's public perception has not followed. Those who trust in the Lord need not live in fear. The Psalmist does not say that we are "safe" from physical harm from people (flesh/mortal). It is just that they cannot destroy what is important and eternal. God's wish for us is to live a life that is not limited by fear.

Prayer – Lord, when I am afraid remind me to put my trust in you for you alone are trustworthy and sufficient for all that I need.

Thursday - Joshua 1:9

9 Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go."

Notes – Like the people of Israel, God shows us a promised land, a life full of the blessings that God wishes to give to us. But the people feared to enter the land. How often are we immobilized by fear and do not move forward? We will probably not be successful in avoiding difficulties anyway. But it is guaranteed that you will miss out on blessings if you avoid life.

Prayer – Lord you are my strength and my courage. Even when I am afraid help me to move forward boldly as I trust you.

Friday - Proverbs 3:5-6

5 Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; 6 in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.

Notes – Our human tendency is to try to control and fix things. We start and finish by trying to figure things out. But what if the answer is not our ability but our heart. What if we started first with prayer? Start by taking a deep breath, relax, trust God who will then show us the true nature of things and the way through.

Prayer – Lord, create a holy space, a holy pause, between me and all the issues of life so that in that space with you I may receive all that I need to do all that I need to do.

Saturday - Romans 15:13

13 May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Notes – As you face your day, do you hope that you have the ability and resources to survive the day? Or do you hope that God will provide everything you need? When we trust God for our day, not only do we survive, but we can experience joy and peace!

Prayer – In you I trust. God you made me and know me. Jesus Christ you died to set me free from all that steals life away from me and others. Holy Spirit come with wisdom and power that I might do great things today and give God all the glory.



GPS - Grow, Pray, Study





Jeremiah 17:7-8, John 14:1-3 August 19 – 25, 2018

In 1859 Charles Blondin amazed the world by walking across a tightrope stretched across Niagara Falls. He did it many times including blindfolded, at night, backwards, in a sack, on stilts, on a bicycle and even carried a stove to the middle and cooked an omelet. He famously walked across pushing a wheelbarrow carrying a sack of potatoes. The crowd oohed and aahed. He then asked for audience participation. Yes, the crowd believed he could carry someone across in the wheelbarrow. They cheered at the thought but there were no volunteers. It's one thing for us to say we believe in God. It's true faith though when we believe God by putting our faith and trust in Jesus Christ.

Trust is essential for healthy relationships. I have lost track of how many couples have come to me for counseling because there was a lack of trust. Sometimes the trust had been broken and there was betrayal and hurt. Sometimes there was an inability to trust, not because the partner was untrustworthy. Difficulty in trusting may come from previous times when a person was betrayed by those they trusted. Anxiety and trust also go hand in hand. We are anxious because we do not or cannot trust. It is like we are standing on shaky ground with nothing solid or dependable in our relationships. Until that heart matter is resolved all relationships will be difficult if not impossible.

The only repair for broken trust is to stay in the relationship long enough for the person to regain your trust by being consistently trustworthy. But trust in all relationships is really about trusting God. We trust that God can carry us in the divine wheelbarrow through the difficulties and even treacheries of others. When a relationship is shaky our trust in God means our feet are on solid ground. Though the relationship might break, God is always there to catch our fall.

Monday - Jeremiah 17:7-8

Blessed are those who trust in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord. ⁸ They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit.

Prayer – Lord, I trust you. I trust you to carry me through the difficulty. I trust you in the spiritually dry times. I trust you to produce fruit in my life. Lord, I also trust you to help me when I do not trust you.
