

Wednesday – May 23 – Acts 2:1-13

1 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. 2 And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. 3 Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. 5 Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. 6 And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. 7 Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? 8 And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? 9 Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, 10 Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, 11 Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.' 12 All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?' 13 But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.'

Notes – There are several important themes here. The Spirit makes possible what is impossible for us. The power of the Holy Spirit removes all boundaries. Each ear will hear the truth in a way that can be understood. There will be scoffers. How do we limit ourselves by choosing only to do what is humanly possible rather than trusting God? Keeping to ourselves does nothing. Where do we need to "show up" in life so that the Spirit can use us?

Prayer – *Lord, as I trust you, help me take risks to put myself in situations that may be uncomfortable so that you may use me for your glory.*

Thursday - May 24 – Acts 2:14-17 – Peter Addresses the Crowd

14 But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. 15 Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. 16 No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 17 "In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams."

Notes – You have to be able to describe a new way of living before you can live that life. You have to have a vision of a future that is different from today before you can move into that future. The Holy Spirit provides visions. Human spirit provides delusions. What are your dreams and visions?

Prayer - *Giver of dreams and visions, help me to place my hope in you and turn the dreams you give into plans for action.*

Friday – May 25 – Acts 2:22-28

22 'You that are Israelites, listen to what I have to say: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with deeds of power, wonders, and signs that God did through him among you, as you yourselves know— 23 this man, handed over to you according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of those outside the law. 24 But God raised him up, having freed him from death, because it was impossible for him to be held in its power. 25 For David says concerning him, "I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand so that I will not be shaken; 26 therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; moreover, my flesh will live in hope. 27 For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let your Holy One experience corruption. 28 You have made known to me the ways of life; you will make me full of gladness with your presence."

Notes – Peter proclaims that Jesus is the promised Messiah, the savior who fulfills all of the prophecies concerning the lineage of King David. It is Jesus Christ crucified at the hands of people risen from the dead by the power of God. What people mean for destruction God can use, like a blacksmith can turn a sword into a plow. There is no shortage of human ingenuity and the ability to make weapons out of anything from words to technology. Instead of fear, how do we respond by turning the very efforts to destroy into acts of life-giving love. Examples - responding to racism by embracing the diversity that makes us stronger. Donating organs that turns a death into new life for several people.

Prayer – *Lord, turn my fear into curious hope so that I can embrace the opportunities that you give me this day to make a difference.*

Saturday – May 26 – Acts 2:37-47

37 Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and to the other apostles, 'Brothers, what should we do?' 38 Peter said to them, 'Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him.' 40 And he testified with many other arguments and exhorted them, saying, 'Save yourselves from this corrupt generation.' 41 So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added. 42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Life among the Believers

43 Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. 44 All who believed were together and had all things in common; 45 they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. 46 Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, 47 praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

Notes – Pentecost is the birthday of the church, a community of believers devoted to the apostles' teaching and sharing life. In the face of an epidemic of loneliness here is a model for life together. Praying together, eating together, learning together, growing together, sharing life together. In this way they grew and were blessed. How do we isolate ourselves? How can we as a church and as individuals share life together more fully and deeply?

Prayer – *Lord, you created us for you and for each other. Forgive us when we turn into ourselves. Turn us to you and each other in love and generosity so that all may be blessed.*
