

## **Grow Pray Serve**

Hallelujah Anyhow (Martyrdom)

October 6, 2019

Grow Pray Serve is for personal daily growth and small groups. Simply have your group pick the scriptures and questions that speak to you.

#### Monday - Acts 6:8-15, 7:54-60

Stephen, full of grace and power, did great wonders and signs among the people. Then some of those who belonged to the synagogue of the Freedmen (as it was called), Cyrenians, Alexandrians, and others of those from Cilicia and Asia, stood up and argued with Stephen. But they could not withstand the wisdom and the Spirit with which he spoke. Then they secretly instigated some men to say, 'We have heard him speak blasphemous words against Moses and God.' They stirred up the people as well as the elders and the scribes; then they suddenly confronted him, seized him, and brought him before the council. They set up false witnesses who said, 'This man never stops saying things against this holy place and the law; for we have heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth\* will destroy this place and will change the customs that Moses handed on to us.' And all who sat in the council looked intently at him, and they saw that his face was like the face of an angel. Then the high priest asked him, 'Are these things so?' And Stephen replied.....

**Notes** - God enabled Stephen to be the authentic human God created him to be, "full of grace and power." There is always opposition to love, truth, mercy, grace, which is to say opposition to the power of the Holy Spirit. It is not personal. When are you most authentically alive? When are you most filled with grace? When are you most powerful in the Spirit? How might others oppose you for the very things that God has placed in your life and that please God?

**Prayer** - Surrendered to you, my Lord Jesus Christ, make my life not about me but about you in all things so that I might show forth your life, love and grace in me.

#### Tuesday - Acts 6:8-15, 7:54-60

'You stiff-necked people, uncircumcised in heart and ears, you are forever opposing the Holy Spirit, just as your ancestors used to do. Which of the prophets did your ancestors not persecute? They killed those who foretold the coming of the Righteous One, and now you have become his betrayers and murderers. You are the ones that received the law as ordained by angels, and yet you have not kept it.'

When they heard these things, they became enraged and ground their teeth at Stephen. But filled with the Holy Spirit, he gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. 'Look,' he said, 'I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!' But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.' Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, 'Lord, do not hold this sin against them.' When he had said this, he died.

**Notes** - Before the end of his speech Stephen tells the history of Israel related to Abraham, Joseph, Moses, Joshua, David, and Solomon. Two themes come out of his defense. God's gracious pattern of working with God's people outside of Israel and the temple. The historic pattern of rejection of the Holy Spirit in the leaders and prophets like Moses and Jesus. Where in your life might you oppose the Holy Spirit? We resist change even if it is for our own good. Where might you sabotage what God is trying to do for you?

**Prayer** - Holy Counselor, my life is an open book to you. Be patient with me and show me once again Your way that leads to life and heals my brokenness. And give me the courage to let go so that I might let you.

#### Wednesday - 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

**Notes** - The Greek word for remembrance is anamnesis ( $\dot{\alpha}\nu\dot{\alpha}\mu\nu\eta\sigma\iota\varsigma$ ) It is not simply remembering a past story of Jesus's last supper. It is calling to mind the entire paschal mystery of the cross, the tomb, resurrection, ascension, enthronement and second coming. We enter into the mystery of the divine presence. In short, we die with Christ and rise up to new life with Christ who carries us into the embrace of God's holy presence in victory. How might God be inviting you into mystery? When are the times and situations when you experience the wonder of God's presence and love?

**Prayer** - God you always have a place at your table just for me. Feed me your presence and in your presence. Then in loving gratitude I can go forth and feed the world.

#### Thursday - Luke 22:14-24 - The Institution of the Lord's Supper

When the hour came, he took his place at the table, and the apostles with him. He said to them, 'I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; for I tell you, I will not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God.' Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he said, 'Take this and divide it among yourselves; for I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.' Then he took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' And he did the same with the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood. But see, the one who betrays me is with me, and his hand is on the table. For the Son of Man is going as it has been determined, but woe to that one by whom he is betrayed!' Then they began to ask one another which one of them it could be who would do this.

**Notes** - There are always rumors. The early church was accused of cannibalism for eating the body and drinking the blood of their children. It was also accused of incest because of the love between brothers and sisters. Who would believe that the holy meal of bread and wine and the genuine love and care for one another as if a single family of God could so badly be misunderstood? And in a society that thought nothing of abandoning a newborn in the wild if it was not the gender they wanted. And a society that had rampant abuse on all levels with little or no legal restrictions. So, not much has changed. I can't believe the conspiracy theories people embrace. Why be surprised when people respond to Christ and His church with prejudice. How can we offer ourselves as Christ offered himself - in love, service, and self-sacrifice? How can we respond best when our lives are misunderstood or interpreted?

**Prayer** - Lord, you created a new covenant, a living agreement between heaven and earth that forever changed the way we relate to you and to each other. May our lives, like yours, be poured out as an offering. Use us Lord, all of us, for all the time we have left, to cover the world in love.

#### Friday - Luke 22:25-30 The Dispute about Greatness

A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest. But he said to them, 'The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those in authority over them are called benefactors. But not so with you; rather the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves. For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am among you as one who serves.

'You are those who have stood by me in my trials; and I confer on you, just as my Father has conferred on me, a kingdom, so that you may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and you will sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel.

**Notes** - The verses immediately before this were about the outpouring sacrifice of God's love in the Lord's supper, the death and resurrection of Christ. Yet now the disciples are arguing over who is greater? Jesus himself comes as servant of all. So who is the greatest? What do you need to stop doing to be great? What do you need to start doing?

**Prayer** - Lord, straighten out the twists in my thinking: When I still think the first should be first, remind me that the last will be first. When I still think the winner should take all, remind me that you came to give abundant life that is adequate for all.
