#### **Boundaries**

Genesis 18:16-33, Matthew 22:37-40, August 12 - 18

We all know someone (and that person may be you) who cannot seem to say no. They may always be at work because they cannot say no to a supervisor. They never be home because they cannot say no to their parents. To be the responsible, free and loving adults God created us to be we need to learn to set limits from childhood on. Boundaries are developed and if not fully developed it is very hard for us to have any kind of healthy relationships or even control of our lives. In their excellent book, <u>Boundaries: When to Say Yes, How to Say No To Take Control of Your Life</u>, Dr. Henry Cloud & Dr. John Townsend spell out how boundaries are developed.

## Monday - Bonding - The Foundation for Setting Boundaries 1 John 4:7-16

"<sup>16</sup> So we have known and believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. "

Notes – Love is relationship, and the deepest need of our lives is to belong, to have a deep abiding connection or bond with God and with others. If a baby feels safe and welcome in the first months of life it will attach or bond with mother or whoever the baby's primary caregiver happens to be. When we are not secure that we are loved then we have two bad options. We set limits and risk losing a relationship. Or we don't set limits and we live as a hostage to the demands of another person. Secure in a loving, supportive relationship with God and others we can say no. We may risk the loss of a relationship, but we know we will not lose ourselves.

<u>Prayer</u> – God, relying upon you and the security of our love help me to develop ever deeper loving connections with others.

#### **Tuesday - Separation and Individuation**

#### Luke 2:41-52

<sup>49</sup> He said to them, "Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house."

<u>Notes</u> – Translation – "mom and dad I have values, thoughts, feelings, opinions that are different from yours." After the first few months of life of gazing lovingly in your eyes suddenly your baby is restless, often does not want to be held and is more interested in others and the world around them. This first stage of separation and individuation is called "hatching". This can be a painful change for mother but a necessary change for the child.

<u>Prayer</u> – Lord, let me live my life with the wide-eyed wonder of a child. Restore in me my desire to learn and experience new things!

#### Wednesday - Practicing "I can do anything."

#### Proverbs 7

Proverbs 7:7 "and I saw among the simple ones, I observed among the youths, a young man without sense,"

Notes – The second stage of separation and individuation is "practicing". There is a big wonderful beautiful creation to explore and children at this stage are fearless. Toddlers want to try everything including steep stairs and playing with electric sockets. They want to leave mom behind and no longer see a need for her. They have developed a sense of safety and connection in their relationship with her and now want to explore. But Proverbs 7:7 describes an adult who has never grown out of this stage at the age of around 10 – 18 months. They can be lots of fun but they have no sense of responsibility or limits. They think that anyone who calls them to be an adult is a "wet blanket" trying to ruin their fun.

<u>Prayer</u> – Lord, teach me freedom within limits and discernment between true limits and where I am limited in fear.

#### Thursday - Rapprochement - "I can't do everything."

"I will ascend to the tops of the clouds, I will make myself like the Most High." Isaiah 14:14 Describes the fall of the king of Babylon (and of Satan) who set himself against God and God's will.

<u>Notes</u> – The "rapprochement" means "restoring harmonious relations" The child comes back to mother after the grandiosity of the past few months gives way to the realization that there are limits. As the child develops a sense of self there are tools toddlers use.

- 1. Anger is a gift from God that helps us to know when there's a problem that needs to be confronted. "Children who can appropriately express anger are children who will understand, later in life, when someone is trying to control or hurt them." (Cloud, Henry. Boundaries p. 72. Zondervan.)
- 2. Ownership Suddenly the child is using words like mine, my, and me. This is not sinful self-centeredness and misunderstood as selfishness we are simply learning that there is me and "not me", there is mine and "not mine." Ownership means taking responsibility for your life. What are people like when they don't grow beyond this stage?

Toddlers Rules of Possession

If I like it, it's mine.

If it's in my hand, it's mine.

If I can take it from you, it's mine.

If I had it a little while ago, it's mine.

If it's mine it must never appear to be yours in anyway.

If I'm doing or building something, all the pieces are mine.

If it looks just like mine, it is mine.

If I saw it first, it's mine.

If you are playing with something and you put it down, it automatically becomes mine.

If it's broken, it's yours.

3. NO - I agree with Henry Cloud that the word no is one of the most important words we need to learn. The word no helps us separate ourselves from things we don't like. It helps us define limits and take control of our lives so that we can fulfill our responsibilities. If we cannot say no then we cannot truly say yes. As a pastor I have no problem with people saying no to me because I know that when they say yes they mean it and will carry through.

#### Thursday continued

Prayer – Grounded in your love help me truly take responsibility for my life and choices.

#### Friday – Matthew 5:37

<sup>37</sup> Let your word be 'Yes, Yes' or 'No, No'; anything more than this comes from the evil one."

<u>Notes</u> – It is a parent's task to help our children learn to set boundaries. This means that when possible you respect when your child says no. Your child needs to feel that they are not completely powerless and helpless. For example, if your child doesn't want to give grandma a hug and a kiss you recognize that sometimes they want to be close and sometimes they want to keep to themselves – which you can explain to grandma.

Prayer – Lord free me to say no to what I do not want so that in freedom I may say yes to You.

#### Saturday - John 17:24

<sup>24</sup> Father, I desire that those also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world.

<u>Notes</u> – Our relationship and our sense of self with its boundaries is grounded in God who also has a sense of self and boundaries. The trinity – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are ever in relationship and ever distinct.

<u>Prayer</u> – As you are within yourself, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, help me who is made in your image to ever be in loving relationship, always connected but never losing myself.
