

This team has been tasked to explore what renovations and/or new construction could be done to our building to improve our ability to serve our current AND future guests and members as well as our local Stewartstown community.









GROW PRAY SERVE

When God Chooses Saul Commissioned

October 20, 2019

Grow Pray Serve is for personal daily growth and small groups. Simply have your group pick the scriptures and questions that speak to you.

Monday - Acts 13:1-3

Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen a member of the court of Herod the ruler, and Saul. While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off.

Notes

This passage describes the role of the church in discerning God's call on people's lives. The God-initiated call to ministry commonly involves both the individual and a confirming community. The local body of Christ intimately familiar with the individual's life may notice God's gifting and call on a person's life before the person does. The local faith community affirms a person's call to ministry. Sometimes it takes multiple messages from God and affirmations by the local body before the individual acknowledges and agrees to answer the call. Where is God currently inviting you? Think about others in your church community. Have you noticed God's gifting and call in another person? Is it time to affirm them in that call?

Prayer

God, tune my heart to hear your call. Give me wisdom in community to discern your call in others that your body, the church may be built up and use all of your gifts.

Tuesday - 1 Samuel 3:1-9

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread. At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. Then the Lord called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. The Lord called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the Lord was calling the boy. Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place. Now the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

Notes

When and where do you say to God, "speak, for your servant is listening"? How much time do spend consciously and silently listening to God? If we are God's servants how do we know what to do if we do not listen?

Prayer

Speak Lord, for your servant is listening.

Wednesday - 1 Samuel 3:10-20

Then the Lord said to Samuel, "See, I am about to do something in Israel that will make both ears of anyone who hears of it tingle. On that day I will fulfill against Eli all that I have spoken concerning his house, from beginning to end. For I have told him that I am about to punish his house forever, for the iniquity that he knew, because his sons were blaspheming God, and he did not restrain them. Therefore I swear to the house of Eli that the iniquity of Eli's house shall not be expiated by sacrifice or offering forever." Samuel lay there until morning; then he opened the doors of the house of the Lord. Samuel was afraid to tell the vision to Eli. But Eli called Samuel and said, "Samuel, my son." He said, "Here I am." Eli said, "What was it that he told you? Do not hide it from me. May God do so to you and more also, if you hide anything from me of all that he told you." So Samuel told him everything and hid nothing from him. Then he said, "It is the Lord; let him do what seems good to him." As Samuel grew up, the Lord was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground. And all Israel from Dan to Beer-sheba knew that Samuel was a trustworthy prophet of the Lord.

Notes

Notice that Samuel was truthful about what the Lord told him. Where in your life do you hold back from telling the truth or telling people, including yourself, what they want to hear? (And yes, this pastor is looking the mirror.) Also notice that Eli confirmed that the vision given to Samuel was from the Lord. Anyone can claim that God showed or told them something, that does not make it true. As in discerning God's call it is confirmed by the community. The result is "the Lord was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground. And all Israel knew that Samuel was a trustworthy prophet of the Lord."

Prayer

Lord, I confess that have often ignored your word when I found it too difficult to accept. I often try to please others rather than doing what is right in your eyes. Forgive me, and free me for joyful obedience.

Thursday - Acts 9:20a ,22

For several days he was with the disciples in Damascus ²²Saul became increasingly more powerful and confounded the Jews who lived in Damascus by proving that Jesus^{*} was the Messiah.^{*}

Notes

Saul or as we know him by his Roman name, Paul, was converted by his vision of the risen Christ on the road to Damascus. The result was that this great persecutor of Christians became a powerful presence for God. If God was able to accomplish this in Paul what can God do in your life? Are you too sinful for God to use? Paul not only sinned but was openly God's enemy. Do you lack ability, talent, power? Paul was empowered to turn back those who opposed God. So if God is not able to forgive us nor empower us then either our God is too small or we think too highly of ourselves.

Prayer

God, I cannot sin bigger than you can forgive. Hear my confession...... God, no matter what I believe about my usefulness or abilities I trust your ability to use me to make a difference. I surrender to your will to use me as you will.

Friday - Acts 9:26 - 28

When he had come to Jerusalem, he attempted to join the disciples; and they were all afraid of him, for they did not believe that he was a disciple. ²⁷But Barnabas took him, brought him to the apostles, and described for them how on the road he had seen the Lord, who had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken boldly in the name of Jesus. ²⁸So he went in and out among them in Jerusalem, speaking boldly in the name of the Lord.

Notes

Everyone has a reputation. Do we treat others in the church and community based upon their past? Jesus always met and accepted people as they are with unconditional love, and then called them to new life – to be the person God created them to be, free of sin and using all of their God-given talent. When you meet someone do you treat them based upon their reputation or what you believe about them or do you unconditionally accept them as they are here and now? And, how do you treat the person in the mirror?

Praver

Lord, help me see myself and others with your eyes. Teach me to love them as you love them, and to love myself as you love me.

More about Discernment for Individuals and the Church Community – The Wesleyan Quadrilateral

(1) Scripture, (2) tradition, (3) reason, and (4) experience. For United Methodists, Scripture is considered the primary source and standard for Christian doctrine. Tradition is experience and the witness of development and growth of the faith through the past centuries and in many nations and cultures. Experience is the individual's understanding and appropriating of the faith in the light of his or her own life. Through reason the individual Christian brings to bear on the Christian faith discerning and cogent thought. These four elements taken together bring the individual Christian, as well as the Christian community, to a mature and fulfilling understanding of the Christian faith and the required response of worship and service.
