

#### Tuesday - Genesis 37:3-4

Notes – What happens in your family when there is a favorite? What happens when you are the favorite, or when you are not, or when you think someone is favored. Sometimes we are put on a pedestal and feel like we can never live up to other's expectations. I wonder if Israel's favoritism almost got Joseph killed, or simply that Joseph was obnoxious. All were caught up in a dysfunctional family drama where God was able to twist the plot and bring about blessing. We know that deep narcissism comes from fear. Narcissists do not truly love themselves. They are in love with an idea about themselves. Whenever this imagined image of who they are and who the think they should be is threatened they become upset. Not knowing who they truly are they are fragile. We can only hope and pray that God will let us know that deep in our core is a beloved child of God that Christ thought was important enough to die to redeem and bring back to our true home in God.

**Prayer** – Remind me again and again, Father, that I am your child and that nothing and nobody can take my adoption away from me.

Wednesday – Genesis 37:12-38 – Joseph is sold by his brothers.

**Notes** - Only those close to you can betray you because we expect that family and friends will treat us differently than acquaintances and strangers. And at some time in our life we all have been betrayed. Part of spiritual maturity is accepting the truth that we have been betrayed, that this comes from sin and is part of the human condition, that we are also guilty of betraying those closest to us, and in betraying them we betray God. Acceptance of the truth of our humanity, selfishness and sinfulness in light of God's grace creates the opportunity to forgive and be forgiven. To be freed from hurt, resentment and fear. I think that God was able to use Joseph's suffering to cut through the barriers to spiritual growth and transform Joseph into the kind man who forgave his family and saved them from starvation rather than taking revenge. I think all of us have times when we have felt betrayed, thrown in a pit, sold into slavery, unfairly accused and thrown into prison? And yet it is by God's grace and redemption that we don't have to stay there. Christ paid the price.

**Prayer** – Psalm 40 "I waited patiently for the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry. <sup>2</sup> He drew me up from the desolate pit, out of the miry bog, and set my feet upon a rock, making my steps secure. <sup>3</sup> He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God. Many will see and fear and put their trust in the Lord."

#### Thursday – Genesis 39:1-23

**Notes** – Betrayed by his brothers and by his employer Joseph hits bottom several times. It is clear that Joseph has a lot going for him. He had the looks, the talent, and was well thought of by those around him in Egypt. Obviously by this point he was not the same self-centered obnoxious brat that made his family want to kill him. But God wasn't done with him yet. In all the ups and downs "the Lord was with Joseph" and it needed to be clear that all of who Joseph was, all of his success, and all that was good in his life was *because* God was with him.

**Prayer** –You are always with me and I am grateful to you my God and my redeemer.

Friday – Genesis 40 – Joseph's elevation.

**Notes** – By this time Joseph has been in prison for two years. He was helpful to the cupbearer who then did not return the favor. Eventually he did come to Pharaohs' attention and was able to be helpful to the nation.

Sometimes we feel like nothing we ever do is good enough. That feeling can be part of our sinfulness, self-centeredness and fear. We can never feel like we have earned the love and security that we feel we are entitled too. Joseph simply worked to be faithful to the gifts God had given him. It is clear that it is not the gifts who earned him a reward but God who made all things possible. We may bemoan that we do not look like we think we should, have the ability we think we should, have the opportunities, recognition, rewards we think we should. Yet God's story in our lives is love, care and opportunity beyond measure if we are simply willing to be humble and faithful.

**Prayer** – Lord, may I be attentive to the opportunities you will present to me today to use me to make a difference even if I don't believe I can.

#### Saturday - Genesis 50:15-21

**Notes** – Joseph went from the fantasy of a life where everyone bowed down to him like a god to humility. Although he was the agent God used to save a nation he recognized that despite all of his great looks and ability he was really a tool in the hands of the Master.

**Prayer** – Lord, let me be your tool through which you can do great things that my life may give you glory.

## **GPS - Grow, Pray, Study**



#### July 22-28, 2018

Joseph's story can be read as a tale of spiritual development. To some degree or another all spiritual growth is turning from a self-centered life toward a life centered on God and others. Joseph story starts with dreams of greatness where the whole world bends down to him (Genesis 37). His story ends where God, after bringing him through many trials, shapes him into a servant used by God to save an entire nation and bring redemption to the evilness in his own family. Genesis 50:15-21

**Monday** - Genesis 37:1-11 – Joseph's dream of greatness.

**Notes** - According to the DSM IV, the mental health diagnostic manual, a person with Narcissistic Personality Disorder exhibits at least 5 of the 9 following traits.

- Has a grandiose sense of self-importance.
- Preoccupied with fantasies of unlimited success, power, brilliance, beauty, or ideal love.
- Believes they are "special" and unique and can only be understood by, or should associate with, other special or high-status people (or institutions).
- Requires excessive admiration.
- Has a sense of entitlement.
- Takes advantage of others to achieve own ends.
- · Lacks empathy.
- Envious of others or believes others are envious of them.
- Shows arrogant haughty behavior or attitude.

To a degree all of us exhibit more or less all of these behaviors. Where do you see this in Joseph? In world leaders, CEO's and celebrities? In yourself?

We know that this narcissism is developmentally appropriate for a preschool child (and to a certain degree, adolescence) but have we grown out of it? While society is focused on "what is in it for me?" Christ calls us to a life of loving self-sacrifice as he calls us to take up our cross every day.

**Prayer** – Lord, today and everyday enable me to turn away from my preoccupation with myself and toward you for you alone are enough and you turn me in love and service to others.
