## Friday, October 9, 2020 James 4:4-10

4 Adulterers! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God. 5 Or do you suppose that it is for nothing that the scripture says, "God yearns jealously for the spirit that he has made to dwell in us"? 6 But he gives all the more grace; therefore it says, "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble." 7 Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. 8 Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. 9 Lament and mourn and weep. Let your laughter be turned into mourning and your joy into dejection. 10 Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you.

### Notes

Every day you have a choice to be a friend with the world which makes you actively opposed and hostile to God, or to be a friend of God. The problem is that we have created Christian lifestyles that go along with the world to the point we no longer see the difference. The world (we), crucified Jesus because he didn't just go along with everyone else.

### Prayer

I submit myself to you God and to you alone. I will not just go along with what I know is opposed to You.

### Saturday, October 10, 2020 Mark 2:21-22

21 "No one sews a piece of unshrunk cloth on an old cloak; otherwise, the patch pulls away from it, the new from the old, and a worse tear is made. 22 And no one puts new wine into old wineskins; otherwise, the wine will burst the skins, and the wine is lost, and so are the skins; but one puts new wine into fresh wineskins."

### Notes

I remember this scripture always being mentioned when people would speak against anything new in worship. In short the gospel always brings something new and fresh. It requires that we are always changing. How much do you like change?

### Prayer

Lord, today you made a new day, for me, to be yours, and to make new. Help me embrace your gift and to grow in a new way today.



Daily Devotional Readings for the week of October 4 – October 9

# Surrender and Receive Your Life

Quit Denying Anger, Sadness, and Fear

Throughout the Psalms David pours out his raw emotions. He does not suppress, deny, or minimize his anger, sadness, and fear.

### Monday, October 5, 2020 1 Peter 2:4.9-10

4 Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and 5 like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.
9 But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. 10 Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

### Notes

Ever feel insignificant and powerless? God disagrees. Making nobodies into somebodies, God's own people - a priesthood, chosen, royal, and holy. This is who you are. How can we share what God has done for us and is willing to do for everyone?

### Prayer

Lord, once I was nobody, now I am somebody. Instead of leaving me alone in darkness you have brought me out with you in the light, lifted me up, and gave me work to do. Thank-you. Aid me today as I do what I do for You.

## Tuesday, October 6, 2020 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

17 So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! 18 All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; 19 that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. 20 So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. 21 For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

### Notes

If you are in Christ - you are brand new and the old passed away. Are you in Christ? What old has passed away that you might be holding on to? What is it like for you to be brand new, not just today, but every day?

### Prayer

Lord my old habits, regrets, shames, guilt, You have taken them away but some of them I hold on to. (give God your list) As you reconcile me and draw me close to you, help me to also be your ambassador to bring others to you.

### Wednesday, October 7, 2020 Psalm 119:49-56

49 Remember your word to your servant, in which you have made me hope.
50 This is my comfort in my distress, that your promise gives me life.
51 The arrogant utterly deride me, but I do not turn away from your law.
52 When I think of your ordinances from of old, I take comfort, O Lord.
53 Hot indignation seizes me because of the wicked, those who forsake your law.
54 Your statutes have been my songs wherever I make my home.
55 I remember your name in the night, O Lord, and keep your law.
56 This blessing has fallen to me, for I have kept your precepts.

### Notes

How might God's word bring hope, comfort, give life? Have these words done those very things?

### Prayer

Pray the words of the Psalm adapting as needed for your life and situation.

## Thursday, October 8, 2020 Psalm 106 - A Confession

1 Praise the Lord! O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever. 2 Who can utter the mighty doings of the Lord, or declare all his praise? 3 Happy are those who observe justice, who do righteousness at all times.4 Remember me, O Lord, when you show favor to your people; help me when you deliver them; that I may see the prosperity of your chosen ones, that I may rejoice in the gladness of your nation, that I may glory in your heritage. 6 Both we and our ancestors have sinned; we have committed iniquity, have done wickedly.

### **Notes**

God's steadfast love means firm, resolute, unwavering, love for us. Earthquakes can shake the rock on which we stand. God's love is more firm than bedrock. Yet such awareness of God's love shines a light on how far we fall short thus the need for confession.

### Prayer

Lord, keep me aware of Your presence and Your love today and always. Make me aware of how and when I am unloving so that I may allow You to make me ever more like You.
