Tuesday - Matthew 10:34-39

³⁴ "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth; I have not come to bring peace, but a sword.³⁵ For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law;³⁶ and one's foes will be members of one's own household.
³⁷ Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; ³⁸ and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me. ³⁹ Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it.

Notes – Christian spiritual maturity means following your path even when it causes conflict. We are not called to live lives that appease others or even please others. Only the cross-shaped life of Christian-discipleship is pleasing to God. Parents want their child to be safe and happy (besides it makes the parent look good.) But following Christ is guaranteed to be unsafe and no guarantee of happiness. Jesus lived a life that was the perfect expression of unconditional love and grace and look at what happened to him. We are called to love people no one loves in times and places everyone avoids. True peacemaking disrupts false peace. When avoiding conflict by appeasing family we are not only false-peacemakers, but we are compromising who we are and not living the fully joyful obedient life that God has created for us.

Prayer – Jesus, you took the cross for my sins and you call me to follow. Help me to embrace the freedom from living in a way that appears others – a way of freedom that you won for me at such a great cost.

Wednesday - Daniel 1:8-17

⁸ But Daniel resolved that he would not defile himself with the royal rations of food and wine; so he asked the palace master to allow him not to defile himself. ⁹ Now God allowed Daniel to receive favor and compassion from the palace master. ¹⁰ The palace master said to Daniel, "I am afraid of my lord the king; he has appointed your food and your drink. If he should see you in poorer condition than the other young men of your own age, you would endanger my head with the king." ¹¹ Then Daniel asked the guard whom the palace master had appointed over Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah: ¹² "Please test your servants for ten days. Let us be given vegetables to eat and water to drink. ¹³ You can then compare our appearance with the appearance of the young men who eat the royal rations, and deal with your servants according to what you observe." ¹⁴ So he agreed to this proposal and tested them for ten days. ¹⁵ At the end of ten days it was observed that they appeared better and fatter than all the young men who had been eating the royal rations. ¹⁶ So the guard continued to withdraw their royal rations and the wine they were to drink and gave them vegetables. ¹⁷ To these four young men God gave knowledge and skill in every aspect of literature and wisdom; Daniel also had insight into all visions and dreams.

Note – Instead of compromising his religious practices Daniel resolved not to let the King dictate what he would eat and drink. He did not resort to dirty fighting tactics: silent treatment, lecturing, blaming/attacking, condescension, threatening gestures, name-calling, criticizing, sarcasm, complaining, denying, walking away, placating, avoiding, shouting, using "always" and "never", anger/rage, passive-aggressive behavior, lying, hitting/violence, showing contempt. Instead he talked to the guard adult to adult, offered a proposal that could accomplish both of their goals with results that they could measure. Where do you find yourself giving in to pressure rather than confront was is needed for healthy and godly life?

Prayer – God give me the courage to take a stand against this world's pressures that are contrary to your will for me and what you have taught me is right and true.

Thursday – John 8:31

³¹ Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; ³² and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free."

Notes – The man is engaged. He thinks that he made a mistake but knows that his fiancés family would be angry. He says nothing, and the unhappy brief marriage ends in divorce. He did not tell the truth and was a false-peacemaker. The woman thinks her boyfriend is irresponsible, but she feels bad for him. She knows his childhood was painful and she does not want to add to his pain. She does not tell him the truth that his behavior is killing their relationship which dies a slow painful death. She is not telling the truth and is a false-peacemaker. If we continue in Jesus word – which is not Jesus "words" but all the truth that is Jesus Christ, we will know and speak the truth to ourselves and others. In both these examples telling the truth would have been painful but nothing compared to the drawn-out pain caused by sin.

Prayers – Jesus, you are the truth of life, the only truth I need. Let your life and your truth be lived in me.

Friday – Matthew 5:3-11

- ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ⁴ "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- ⁵ "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.
- ⁶ "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.
- ⁷ "Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.
- ⁸ "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.
- ⁹ "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.
- ¹⁰ "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ¹¹ "Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely^[b] on my account. ¹² Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Notes — Leading up to verse 9 - these are the characteristics of true peacemakers -to know we need God, poor in spirit, humble, merciful, pure in heart, etc.

Prayer – Knowing I am nothing without you Lord, I mourn, I am humble, I want more of what you give, in humility I give to others the mercy you have given me, staying true in my heart.

Saturday - Matthew 5

²³ So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister^[] has something against you, ²⁴ leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, ^[] and then come and offer your gift.

Prayer – Lord, help me to make peace with all that is unreconciled between me and others and within myself. Make me a fit instrument for your work and pleasure as a peace-made peace-maker.

Notes - There are a variety of ways to resolve conflict, but God's way is truly peace-making and win-win. "I win, you lose" works except you tramp all over the rights and humanity of the other person plus no one likes a bully. Few see this way as "Christian".

"I give in to keep the peace," works except you become resentful and are prone to having others take advantage of you. Christians often have wrong beliefs about peacemaking. When we feel that we need to avoid conflict and appease people we are false peacemakers.
