#### **Tuesday** – Mark 10:17-22

<sup>17</sup> As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" <sup>18</sup> Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. <sup>19</sup> You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honor your father and mother.'" <sup>20</sup> He said to him, "Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth." <sup>21</sup> Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money<sup>[c]</sup> to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." <sup>22</sup> When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Notes – The Gospels are filled with stories of Jesus encountering people, Zacchaeus, Matthew the tax collector, a Samaritan woman, Nicodemus. When the rich young ruler came to him while setting out on a journey the scripture says "Jesus, looking at him, loved him" Jesus took the time to truly listen. He never rushed, never in too much of a hurry to pay attention to someone and to listen to their story.

Prayer – Lord, you have given me all the time I need to pay attention to others and love them in your name.

#### Wednesday - Proverbs 17:27-28

<sup>27</sup> One who spares words is knowledgeable; one who is cool in spirit has understanding.

<sup>28</sup> Even fools who keep silent are considered wise; when they close their lips, they are deemed intelligent.

Notes – Have you heard the saying, "We have two ears and one mouth so that we can listen twice as much as we speak." – Epictetus. Studies show we can hear around 400 words a minute but speak around 150 words a minute. How well we listen to someone depends upon what we are doing with our brains with that 250 word a minute difference. Unfortunately, we generally are thinking about what we are going to say before we really hear the other person. I have lost track of how many arguments I have heard between people who actually agreed with each other but were not listening!

Prayer – Lord, help me to remain quiet and truly listen so that I may not be distracted but lovingly attentive so that I may embody your love.

#### Thursday - James 1:19

You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger;

Notes – Often we can become angry before we hear the entire story. If we speak quickly we can do so out of ignorance or even slow down understanding by interrupting the other person.

Prayer – Slow me down Lord that I might truly hear what you want me to hear so that I may love as you want me to love.

#### Friday – Matthew 25:31-46

'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? <sup>38</sup> And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? <sup>39</sup> And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' <sup>40</sup> And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, <sup>[g]</sup> you did it to me.'

Notes – What if we treated every person we encounter as Christ in disguise? Did you ever think that God would come to you as someone who needs your help? In this day of fear of strangers and outsiders how might this change our way of thinking and feeling about others?

Prayer – Today, when you come to me, help me to you see you Lord that I may love you.

#### Saturday – Philippians 2:3-4

<sup>3</sup> Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. <sup>4</sup> Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. <sup>5</sup> Let the same mind be in you that was<sup>[a]</sup> in Christ Jesus,

Notes – Setting ourselves aside is an act of humility and self-giving, an act of self-sacrificial love. It is the mind of Christ.

Prayer – Lord, may I consider others as more important than myself in all things so that I might love them as you love.

#### **Improving Our Listening Skills**

Guidelines for the Listener and the Speaker

#### As the Listener:

- Give the speaker your full attention.
- Step into the speaker's shoes and feel what they are feeling.
- Avoid judging or interpreting.
- Reflect back as accurately as you can what you heard them say.
- When you think the speaker is done, ask, "Is there more?"
- When the speaker is done, ask, "Of everything you have shared, what is the most important thing you want me to remember?"

#### As the Speaker:

- Speak in the "I."
- Keep your statements brief.
- Stop to let the listener paraphrase.
- Include your feelings.
- Be honest, clear, and respectful. It is critically important to help people distinguish a thought from a feeling.

# **Love Like Jesus**

July 1-7, 2018

**Monday** - John 1:1-3,14 - The Incarnation - God made flesh.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup> He was in the beginning with God. <sup>3</sup> All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. <sup>14</sup> And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

Notes – Loving someone means being present. Are we fully present, focused on the person, hearing their words, seeing their body language, understanding the context. (see the listening test at the end) Jesus on earth was God made flesh showing us God, God's attitude towards us and how to love incarnationally. When we love others as Jesus loves us God's love is present, active, life-transforming.

Prayer – God, who knows my heart, may I pay attention fully and completely to those I encounter today so that I may love incarnationally. Help me to be your ears, your hands, your feet, your voice proclaiming your love wherever I go.

Give yourself this little listening test. Circle all the statements you can affirm.

- 1. My close friends would describe me as a responsive listener.
- 2. When people are upset with me, I am able to listen to them without being defensive.
- 3. I listen not only to the words people say but also to the feelings behind their words and their body language.
- 4. I have little interest in judging other people or quickly giving my opinion to them.
- 5. I am able to validate another person's feelings with empathy.
- I am aware of my defensive mechanisms in stressful conversations (e.g. appeasing, ignoring, blaming, distracting).
- 7. I am profoundly aware of how the family I was raised in has shaped my present listening style.
- 8. I ask for clarification when listening rather than "fill in the blanks" or make assumptions.
- 9. I don't interrupt to get my point across when another is speaking.
- 10. I give people my undivided attention when they are talking to me.

If you circled 8–10 statements, you are an outstanding listener; if you circled 6–7, you are very good; 4–5, good; 3 or fewer, poor—"you are in trouble." If you want to be really brave, after you score yourself, ask your spouse or someone close to you to rate you as a listener. You may be surprised....
