

Notes - As always there is a divided response to the gospel between those who believe and those who do not. If you believe that the signs of the times spell doom then the only rational response is despair and this is the worldly response. Christians live by the power of the Holy Spirit and see the signs of the times as God's work and new creation. So what happens when you refuse to buy into the doom and gloom view of the world that we hear every day? Will you be viewed as irrational? crazy? maybe even drunk? Do you believe in God enough to speak words of hope even if it alienates you from some?

Prayer - God, I believe help my unbelief. I trust you for the future help my mistrust. Help me live in the confident hope that is the mark of your Holy Spirit.

Wednesday - Peter's Sermon

22 'You that are Israelites, listen to what I have to say: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with deeds of power, wonders, and signs that God did through him among you, as you yourselves know— 23 this man, handed over to you according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of those outside the law. 24 But God raised him up, having freed him from death, because it was impossible for him to be held in its power. 25For David says concerning him,

"I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand so that I will not be shaken; 26 therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; moreover, my flesh will live in hope. 27 For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let your Holy One experience corruption. 28 You have made known to me the ways of life; you will make me full of gladness with your presence."

Notes - God's will is for everyone to be freed and reconciled. Jesus' death was not an accident but a consequence of this mission from God that he chose to accept. We often try to control our anxiety by seeking to control others and our surroundings. What happens when we choose to stop trying to control and fix everything and everyone and accept God's freedom instead? What happens when we choose to trust God, to let go and to let God?

Prayer - A Note from God -

Don't worry about everything around you. That's my job. signed, Love, God.

Thursday - Peter's Sermon Acts 2:29-36

29 'Fellow Israelites, I may say to you confidently of our ancestor David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. 30 Since he was a prophet, he knew that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would put one of his descendants on his throne. 31 Foreseeing this, David spoke of the resurrection of the Messiah, saying, "He was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh experience corruption." continued

32 This Jesus God raised up, and of that all of us are witnesses. 33Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you both see and hear. 34For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself says, "The Lord said to my Lord, 'Sit at my right hand, 35 until I make your enemies your footstool.' "36 Therefore let the entire house of Israel know with certainty that God has made him both Lord and Messiah, this Jesus whom you crucified.'

Notes - We see again that the death of Jesus was a consequence of God's desire that all people should be freed from sin and death. King David, speaking prophetically was pointing to Jesus. Jesus decision to follow God's way of unconditional love meant being put to death by those who found unconditional love inconvenient, especially those seeking religious/political/economic power. Where are the places in your life where you see that following God's will have difficult consequences? Like following your conscience may cost you a job or relationship. Where do you experience those who are seeking power today finding unconditional love inconvenient because it makes scapegoating or identifying common enemies impossible?

Prayer - Holy Spirit, switch on my capacity to love, accept, and live passionately according to God's will.

Friday - Galatians 5:22-23

the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Notes - We go back to this important passage again and again. Note that these are produced by the Holy Spirit in our lives. If we are not experiencing more, than something is wrong. Depression is a biological, emotional, spiritual illness that is highly treatable. Its primary attitude is hopelessness which is a symptom and not a reality. But once clinically diagnosed and treated, depression is ruled out, we have to ask who is on the throne. When God is on the throne of our lives we feel loved, calmed, relieved and every good thing flows from that relationship with God. But when we try to have it both ways, God in our lives but we still want to be in charge, all our energy gets wasted in a fruitless (get it?) power struggle. Where in your life do you still need to surrender to God?

Prayer - Glory be to the Father, to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end.

Saturday - Holy Spirit, come into my heart; draw it to Thee by Thy power, O my God, and grant me charity with filial fear. Preserve me, O beautiful Love, from every evil thought; warm me, inflame me with Thy dear love, and every pain will seem light to me. My Father, my sweet Lord, help me in all my actions. Jesus, love, Jesus, love. Amen.

Notes - The prayer's author, St. Catherine of Sienna, was a Christian mystic and powerful church leader of the 14th century. Her writings capture a deep passionate relationship with God that captures a person's whole being with the all powerful love of the Trinity.

GPS – Grow, Pray, Study

May 12 – May 18, 2019

Monday - Acts 2:4-12 selected – The Coming of the Holy Spirit and Peter Addresses the Crowd

4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. 5 Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. 6And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. 7 Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? 8And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ...in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.' 12 All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?'

Notes - Pastor's summary - The bewildered amazed astonished people were hearing of God's deeds of power in a way that they could understand. This is made possible by the power of the Holy Spirit. What prevents us from doing the same? What are the ways we can express our experience of God to others in ways they can understand? How do we allow the Holy Spirit to make this happen in our lives? We can if we show up, if we pay attention, and if we allow God to use our presence, to give us stillness in silence or words if needed.

Prayer - Lord, in my encounters with others enable me to be present and attentive to the presence of your Holy Spirit and to other person's heart that you may help me love them in your name.

Tuesday - Acts 2:13-21

13 But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.'

14 But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. 15 Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning.

16 No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

17 "In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. 18 Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. 19 And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. 20 The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. 21 Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved." continued
