Leviticus 23

Feast	Hebrew Month	Day(s)	Approx. Modern Month	Biblical Reference	Notes
Passover (Pesach)	Nisan (1st month)	14	March–April	Leviticus 23:5	
Unleavened Bread	Nisan	15–21	March–April	Leviticus 23:6–8	
Firstfruits	Nisan	Day after the Saturday Sabbath during Unleavened Bread (traditionally Nisan 16)	March–April	Leviticus 23:9–14	
Feast of Weeks (Shavuot/Pentecost)	Sivan (3rd month)	6 (50 days after Firstfruits)	May–June	Leviticus 23:15–22	
Feast of Trumpets (Rosh Hashanah)	Tishri (7th month)	1	September–October	Leviticus 23:23–25	
Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur)	Tishri	10	September–October	Leviticus 23:26–32	
Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkot)	Tishri	15–21 (Sacred Assembly on the 22nd)	September–October	Leviticus 23:33–44	

Biblical Calendar Overview

Biblical Month	Modern Equivalent	Feast(s)
Nisan (1st)	March–April	Passover, Unleavened Bread, Firstfruits
Sivan (3rd)	May–June	Feast of Weeks (Shavuot/Pentecost)
Tishri (7th)	September–October	Trumpets, Day of Atonement, Tabernacles

The Seven Feasts in Order

1. Passover — **Nisan 14**
2. Unleavened Bread — **Nisan 15–21**
3. Firstfruits — **During Unleavened Bread**
4. Weeks (Shavuot/Pentecost) — **Sivan 6** (*50 days later*)
5. Trumpets — **Tishri 1**
6. Day of Atonement — **Tishri 10**
7. Tabernacles — **Tishri 15–21** (*Assembly on Tishri 22*)

Hebrew Months

1. Nisan (March–April)
2. Iyar (April–May)
3. Sivan (May–June)
4. Tammuz (June–July)
5. Av (July–August)
6. Elul (August–September)
7. Tishri (September–October)
8. Cheshvan / Marcheshvan (October–November)
9. Kislev (November–December)
10. Tevet (December–January)
11. Shevat (January–February)
12. Adar (February–March)

Note: In Jewish leap years, which happen 7 times every 19 years, an extra month called Adar I is inserted before the standard Adar (which is then called Adar II) to ensure seasonal holidays like Passover remain in the spring.
