#### THE KINGS ROYAL SUBJECTS

"The Price of Following Jesus" **Luke 9:57-62** 

#### INTRODUCTION:

- 1. QUESTION: "Have you ever heard someone say, 'If I had known what I was getting into, I never would have said Yes"
- 2. There is a cost to discipleship.
- 3. Jesus calls disciples to follow Him even though there are no guarantees.
  - a) In fact, there is often a cost associated with true discipleship.
  - b) AND that is why it's not a very popular concept, even though it's true.
- 4. In Luke 9 we are introduced to three men who walked away from following Christ.
- 5. In Luke 9, Jesus didn't offer these men special discipleship deals.
  - a) What Jesus did offer them was himself and in reality, that's all they needed
- 6. A disciple is one who follows Christ and assists in spreading the good news.
- 7. Luke 9:57-62
  - a) In this passage Jesus and His disciples are headed toward Jerusalem.
    - 1) Vs 51 55

#### THREE EXAMPLES TALKING A GOOD GAME

(But unwilling to get off the bench.)

- As Jesus traveled during his ministry he encountered many would-be followers.
- God's goal is not merely your salvation but your commitment to discipleship.
- God's desire isn't just for us to show up to church on Sunday but to be visible, verbal followers every day.

### I. PROSPECTIVE DISCIPLE #1

- 1. Vs 57
  - a) "I will follow you..." actually means, "I will imitate you"
  - b) "wherever you go"
- 2. Notice Jesus' reply: Jesus has a way of exposing our motives.
  - a) **Vs 58a** 
    - 1) "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests...." Jesus said to him,

- b) **Vs 58b** 
  - 1) "but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head."
- 3. Jesus basically said that He had no permanent home and if someone chose to follow Him, there were guarantees they would have a home.
  - a) That the call to become a disciple will become hard at times.

## 4. 2 Timothy 3:12

5. THERE IS ABSOLUTELY NO DOUBT that this man SAW with his own eyes the miracles of Jesus and thought he wanted to be part of the action.

#### II. PROSPECTIVE DISCIPLE #2

- 1. Vs 59
  - a) "To another he said, Follow me"
    - 1) The word "follow" means to imitate "Come imitate me."
- 2. So, this second guy was a **conscientious observer** and was listening to the conversation Jesus had with the first guy.
  - a) A conscientious observer is someone who pays close attention to details and observes situations with care and thoughtfulness but doesn't get involved.
- 3. LOOK AT HOW THIS MAN RESPONDED Vs 59
  - a) "Lord" He addresses Jesus as "Master".
  - b) "Let me first go bury my father"

## 4. NOW LOOK AT WHAT JESUS SAID - Vs 60

- a) "Leave the dead bury their own dead"
  - 1) What is Jesus talking about?
  - 2) Aren't we supposed to honor our parents?
  - 3) However, when we investigate Jewish culture, if that man's father had actually died, he would be with him @ home.
- b) Jesus was saying "Let the spiritually dead, bury the spiritually dead."
- 5. This man was actually telling Jesus, that he needed to put off following Jesus until a day when his father would die.
  - a) And then of course the legal matters of the estate would be settled.
- 6. Jesus said, "Let the dead bury their dead. But as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God."
  - a) Jesus' point was you can't delay the calling of the Kingdom.

- 7. LISTEN UP: But isn't that what so many Christians do?
  - a) So many Christians just aren't ready to fully commit.
- 8. Discipleship always comes with a cost.
  - a) Matthew 16:24

## III. PROSPECTIVE DISCIPLE #3

## 1. Vs 61

- a) Like the first man he said, "I will follow you Lord" (Master)
- b) "but first let me say farewell to those at my home"
- 2. Sounds reasonable!! Especially since he was going away for a while and not exactly sure when he would be back.

## 3. **Vs 62**

- 4. Jesus sees right through empty words.
  - a) He knew the potential was there to linger and get talked out of following Jesus by his family.
  - b) The man's mention of his family left the door open for them to persuade him to rethink his decision.
- 5. Jesus says that anybody who looks back after starting out on the path of following Him is not fit for the kingdom.
  - a) Why is that? Because you can't plow looking over your shoulder.
- 6. Jesus is saying that if we try to plow looking back, we are going to mess up His Kingdom agenda.

#### 7. Luke 17:32

- a) She left Sodom, but Sodom never left her.
- b) She heard the fire and brimstone raining down on Sodom.
  - 1) She remembered her friends back there.
  - 2) She remembered all her possessions back there.
  - 3) She began to regret leaving.
  - 4) So, she looked back despite the angel's warning. *Genesis* 19:17
- c) AND GOD STOPPED HER RIGHT THERE Genesis 19:26
  - 1) She was judged unfit to go any further.

# CONCLUSION:

- 1. In **Genesis 22**, God asked for and received Abraham's offer of sacrificing his son Isaac.
- 2. When you give God your first and best, He gives you His first and best.
- 3. If you make God and His kingdom a priority, He knows where the rams in the thickets hang out.
- 4. You can trust Him with everything. In order to live as a King's Royal Subject, we will have to do just that.
