Acts 9:1-18 (NLT)

- Saul was a self-described Pharisee (Philippians 3:5).
- He was born to Jewish parents, and was a Roman citizen. The melting pot of influence he had as a child and young man crafted a deep hatred for Christianity in Saul's heart.
- Saul was even present at the execution of Stephen, the first Christian martyr.
- He was well known as a terrorist among Christians. He hunted them down. He often entered their homes and shackled both the men and women and returned them to the High Priests to be put on trial. He had a notorious reputation amongst believers.
- Our purpose is not contingent upon our qualities. God knew our qualities when He established our purpose!
