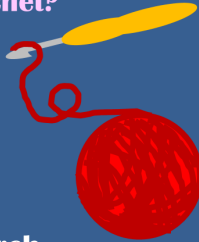

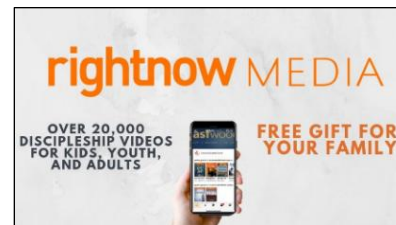



Matthew 15:1-20

¹Then some Pharisees and scribes came to Jesus from Jerusalem and said, ²"Why do Your disciples break the tradition of the elders? For they do not wash their hands when they eat bread." ³And He answered and said to them, "Why do you yourselves also break the commandment of God for the sake of your tradition? ⁴For God said, 'Honor your father and mother and, the one who speaks evil of father or mother is to be put to death.' ⁵But you say whoever says to his father or mother, 'Whatever I have that would help you has been given to God,' ⁶he is not to honor his father or mother.' And by this you have invalidated the word of God for the sake of your tradition. ⁷You hypocrites, rightly did Isaiah prophesy about you, by saying: ⁸'This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far away from Me. ⁹And in vain do they worship Me teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.'" ¹⁰After Jesus called the crowd to Him, He said to them, "Hear and understand! ¹¹It is not what enters the mouth that defiles the person, but what comes out of the mouth, this defiles the person." ¹²Then the disciples came and said to Him, "Do You know that the Pharisees were offended when they heard this statement?" ¹³But He answered and said, "Every plant which My heavenly Father did not plant will be uprooted. ¹⁴Leave them alone; they are blind guides of blind people. And if a person who is blind guides another who is blind, both will fall into a pit." ¹⁵Peter said to Him, "Explain the parable to us." ¹⁶Jesus said, "Are you also still lacking in understanding? ¹⁷Do you not understand that everything that goes into the mouth passes into the stomach and is eliminated? ¹⁸But the things that come out of the mouth come from the heart, and those things defile the person. ¹⁹For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murders, acts of adultery, other immoral sexual acts, thefts, false testimonies, and slanderous statements. ²⁰These are the things that defile the person; but to eat with unwashed hands does not defile the person."

OPENING DISCUSSION

1. What was the main thing you learned from the sermon?
2. What questions do you have about anything that was raised during the message?

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What special traditions does your family cherish that really hold meaning for you?
2. Explore the meaning of the word 'transgression' and how it relates to **Matthew 15:1-3**. What is the significance in this biblical context?
3. Traditionalism is an attitude that insists something must be preserved at all costs. Can you give some examples of where this ideology might hinder the church, Christians, and families?
4. How can we confidently establish boundaries to prevent traditionalism from infiltrating our homes, churches, and teachings?
5. How do you truly welcome someone when they share biblical truth with you? Do you respond in the way you ideally should?
6. Read **Matthew 13:24-30** and **Matthew 15:13-14**. Consider: what impact could these false teachings have on those who are not firmly grounded in doctrine? Reflect on the importance of discernment to protect your faith.
7. Explain why the heart holds such deep significance in shaping who we are as Christians and guiding us in our daily lives.
8. How do we keep our hearts from becoming defiled: What specific actions or attitudes can we adopt to protect our inner purity from negative influences such as dishonesty, bitterness, or temptation?
