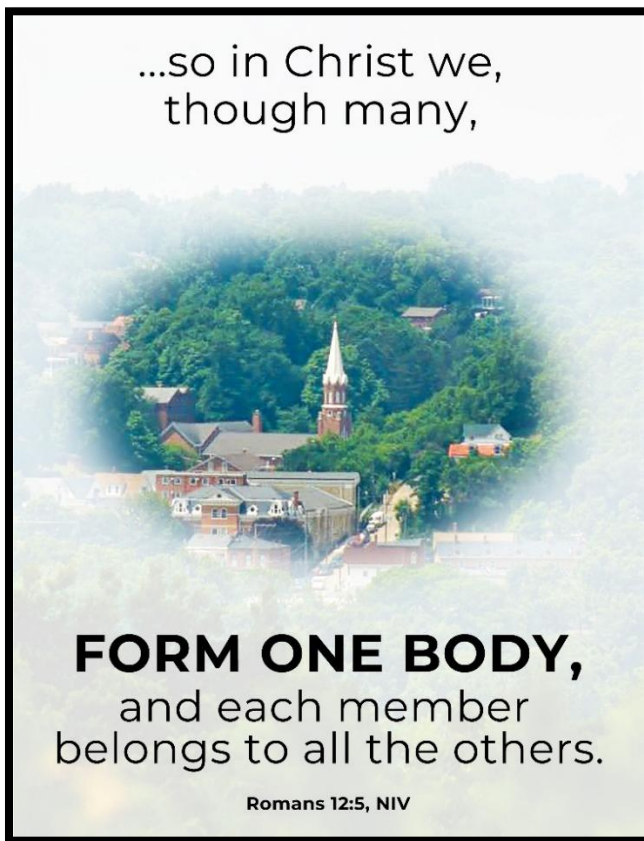

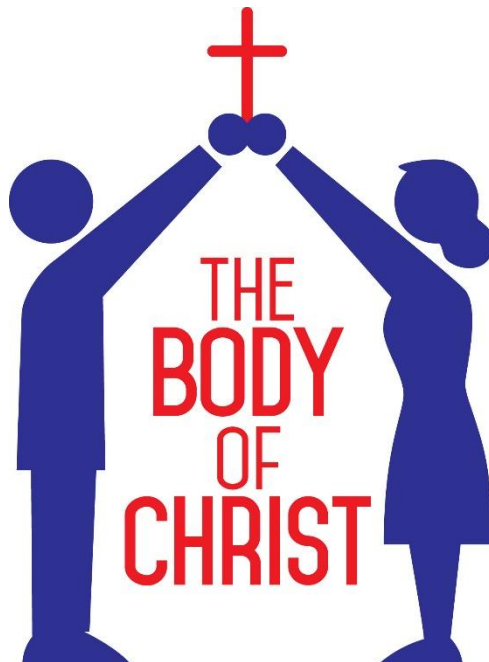

Prayer Focus

Benevolence can be defined as an act of kindness or being helpful. In context of the Scripture, it is love expressed in deeds offered in sincerity. Benevolence are acts of compassion directed towards members of the Body of Christ, and the Community. Sorrow and grief are universal and experienced at the loss of something precious, especially a family member or close friend. Other losses may include the loss of a house to fire or flood, the loss of employment leading to imposition of financial difficulties, the loss of health due to severe illness, divorce, and for some the loss of a pet can be traumatic. God has designed lovingkindness as an expression of His compassion extended towards us, in us, and through us as we willingly and willfully enter the pain and suffering of others.

The past year Wesley Chapel has expressed benevolence within our congregation. Benevolence meals and other expressions of compassion have been extended to our families who have experienced the death of family. Other forms of benevolence have been expressed by providing financial support to Women's Resources, St. Andrews, SAFE, and through the provision of a pastor's discretionary fund that has assisted members of the community with utilities, rent, purchase of medical supplies and equipment. The Women's Circle and Men's Club helped address the needs of the congregation and community.

As your pastor I am exploring ways through which we may expand our benevolence responses and may form a benevolence committee to assist in the assessment of needs and manner of distribution. I appreciate Wesley Chapel's compassion and generosity and faithfulness to respond to congregation and community needs.
