Prayer Focus: Praying for the Persecuted

Thankfully we do not face persecution in our nation. Government policy includes free expression to practice our faith without government interference, and our judicial system provides recourse against anyone who would infringe upon our rights to assemble for worship or preach the Gospel. There are other nations where such cherished freedoms are denied, and Christians are being persecuted.

Historically, the early church survived emerging from *The Heroic Age* (33-300 AD), a period in which men and women refused to recant their faith in Christ and suffered severe consequences including ostracization, imprisonment, torture, and execution. Stephen is the first recorded martyr (Acts 7) followed by James

(Acts 12:2), Antipas (Rev 2:13), Polycarp (the Bishop of Smyrna, c. 69-155 AD), and others. Under the reign of Roman Emperor Diocletian reign (245-311 AD), at least 20,000 Christians died. Since then, untold numbers of Christians have been persecuted for their faith becoming martyrs rather than recant.

These men and women endured unspeakable terror and for their faithfulness they await in the presence of our Lord (2 Cor 5:6-8; Rev. 6:9-11). Yet, in this present hour Christians have been, and are being persecuted around the world. While we are encouraged by the faith of the martyrs, we should also take courage from the survivors of persecution in this present hour. Stories are told of miraculous deliverances, but with every story of deliverance there are thousands of stories of endurance, those who refuse to recant their faith and suffer the physical pains of affliction, and the emotional pains of depravity and have little knowledge of the welfare of the persecuted or the welfare of the families of the persecuted

Persecution may be motivated by Religious Nationalism, Islamic Extremism, Totalitarian Insecurity, or Secular Intolerance. It may come from a government, organized crime, cultural retribution, the family, and the Church. Further, generally, the most persecuted are churches and congregations that are growing and making an impact in their community, which is especially true in Iran. Most recently brothers and sisters in Africa and India have suffered from the violence of persecutors.

How should we pray?

The Apostle Paul writes when one member of the body suffers, all the members suffer (1 Cor 12:26). We cannot begin to know what our persecuted brothers and sisters are experiencing but our Heavenly Father does. We can pray for their deliverance, we can pray for the Spirit's comfort, and we can pray the Spirit will encourage those who may be growing weak in their faith. We can meet with our Father and intercede on their behalf. We can pray!
