

Prayer Focus

Wesley Chapel congregants are encouraged to pray for the many and varied needs facing us: individuals, family, community, special needs as they arise, concerns for health, and provisions of material resources. Prayers are for wisdom, direction, encouragement, and consolation as needed. Providing specifics for needs and designed approach to prayer helps ensure that we are united in purpose and specifically identify the needs based upon scriptural foundations that address the issues and concerns of those for whom prayer is offered.

A Call to Prayer Action for Nigeria

The Global Methodist Church has been developing a partnership with Nigeria, and in recent events, there have been many obstacles hindering this relationship. Currently, there are 86 Global Methodist students studying in Lagos at West Africa Theological Seminary, and in Jalingo, the Global Methodist Women had a rally that encompassed 5-8,000 people. At their recent Central Annual Conference, 6 deacons and 8 elders were ordained. In Karim Maundi, Ethel Johnson Comprehensive Secondary School has about 200 students. The North Alabama Methodists helped to build this school. Unfortunately, the country has been under attack by Islamic extremists in Christian areas, and the Global Methodist churches have been under attack by fellow Christians in the United Methodist Church. This has raised an issue with security and protection for Nigerian Christians. The Global Methodist Church has been trying to work with Fulani Islamic extremists in developing peace and reconciliation so that there can be coexistence with Christians. Tragically, one of the unprovoked attacks that took place claimed 42 lives, and many homes were burned to the ground. The GMC is calling on the government to act justly in protecting Christians. Boko Haran, another extremist group, in northern Nigeria is trying to establish an Islamist caliphate of Islamic law by driving out all Christians with devastating attacks. Churches have been demolished and more homes burned displacing many families.

Specific Needs for Nigeria: food, emergency shelters, clothing, medical treatment, security and protection, intercessory prayers for safety and peace.

Voice of the Martyrs is also at work in Nigeria trying to provide medical and material assistance after violent attacks, replacing bibles that have been destroyed, and equipping front-line workers to reach Muslims for Christ.
