Prayer: The Powerhouse of the Church

“These all with one mind were continually devoting themselves to prayer...” Acts 1:14

Behind every successful pastor is a praying church. Too often we look to the gifted, charismatic preacher as if they alone are responsible for producing the spiritual goals of the church when since the early days of the church, success depended upon not only a praying preacher but a congregation that prays. A praying church provides the atmosphere in which the Holy Spirit anoints preachers and provides meaningful worship experiences.

Nineteenth century English Pastor Charles Spurgeon, known to many as the “Prince of Preachers” successfully led his congregation to what in today’s terms would be regarded as a “mega-church.” In the Metropolitan Tabernacle he spoke to six thousand and on Monday evening prayer meeting, thousands came to hear his message. The congregation went beyond the meeting house and extended its influence through establishing an almshouse, orphanage, and institutions addressing other community needs.

It is Spurgeon who deflected any credit for his success of his preaching and its effectiveness. When people walked through Metropolitan Tabernacle, Spurgeon took them to the basement prayer room where people could be found interceding for the church. He would then declare, “Here is the powerhouse of the church.”

The impact of the church is not necessarily dependent upon the seen, the visible individual or his or her talents, but upon the unseen, those who hide away to the basements and prayer rooms of churches and bring their petitions to the throne of glory.

Wesley Chapel provides two venues for prayer. The prayer room of the vestibule provides a place to pray, and one of the classrooms in the education plant has been devoted as a prayer chapel. Between Sunday School and you are invited to attend a prayer prior to the service; and unless otherwise announced, opportunity for group prayer is available at 5:00 p.m.

To adapt the words of Methodist Episcopal pastor, E.M. Bounds (c. 1835 – 1913), God does not anoint mechanisms, organization, programs or methods, or plans, but churches that pray.


