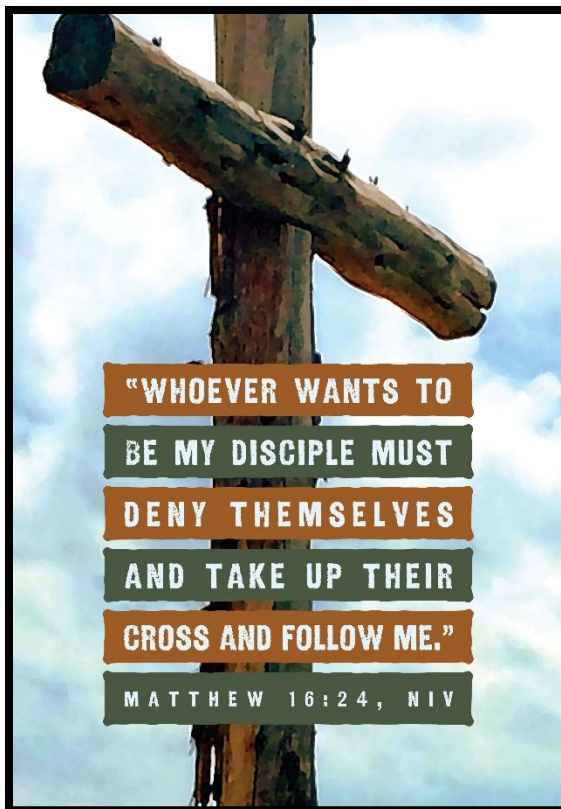

Prayer Focus:

Each Sunday an important part of our worship experience is the Lord's Prayer. As we engage in unison in this prayer, we not only form a bond between members of the congregation, but also a vital link between the early church and with Christ Himself. The Lord's Prayer is Jesus's model prayer for His disciples.

There are two versions of the Lord's Prayer, one found in Matthew and the other in Luke. The difference in the wording focuses upon the difference in the context

in which Jesus shares the prayer. Luke's version provides a response to the disciples' request that Jesus teach them to pray like John taught his disciples to pray. This indicates how prayer was stressed and having seen the prayer life of Jesus, they realized it was through prayer that He discerned the Father's will and directed and empowered.

Matthew's version provides expressions of righteousness, which include giving to the poor, prayer, and fasting. Jesus introduces the Prayer by first teaching the disciples they should not pray for pretense and show but offered with the expectation of the Father's good will nor fruitless repetitions to be heard.

Matthew's version is divided into two divisions, first are the petitions for God to sanctify His name in the earth. His name is exalted through the execution of His will on the earth just as it is done in heaven. God is honored when we set our priorities first on seeking the kingdom of God and His righteousness above our own anxieties, and believing that He is fully aware of our needs, but by directing our prayer first on His behalf, He will provide our needs and eliminate our worries and concerns for the basics of life, including food, drink, clothing – the basic necessities of life.

The second division invites us to first address the necessity of life – daily bread drawing the imagery of Yahweh's provision of manna while Israel trekked through the wilderness. Daily amplifies the Proverb requesting bread sufficient for the immediate need, not too much that we should forget who provided, or too little that we might reproach God. Jesus instructs us to forgive others but with a qualifier: forgive us in the same way we forgive others; further, failing to forgive others will hinder His forgiveness of our sins. He directs our prayers towards the temptations of life, that He does not test us, but that rather, He will deliver us from "the" evil, which can consist not only of deliverance from "the evil one" – Satan, but also from our evil inclinations.

We pray The Lord's Prayer with faith and humility, recognizing our dependency upon Him as we pursue His righteousness and kingdom, and all for His glory.
