Temple Timeline

1451 BC Moses dies and is buried by God (**Deuteronomy 34:5-6**). Joshua Enters the Promised Land

1046 BC House of David is built in Jerusalem (**II Samuel 5:11**).

586 BC **TEMPLE #1 DESTROYED**
The Babylonians destroy Jerusalem and the Temple **II Kings 25:6-11**

1012 BC Foundation of **TEMPLE #1** was laid.
Completed in 1005 BC
Solomon, the son of David, builds the 1st Temple

1063 BC David is anointed king in Bethlehem (**II Samuel 16**).

Bible yearly Calendar with 7 Feast Days

Passover – 14th Day of the 1st Month
Feast of Unleavened Bread – 15th – 21st of the 1st month
Feast of First Fruits – The day after the Sabbath, after the Passover (always on a Sunday)
Leviticus 23:4-14

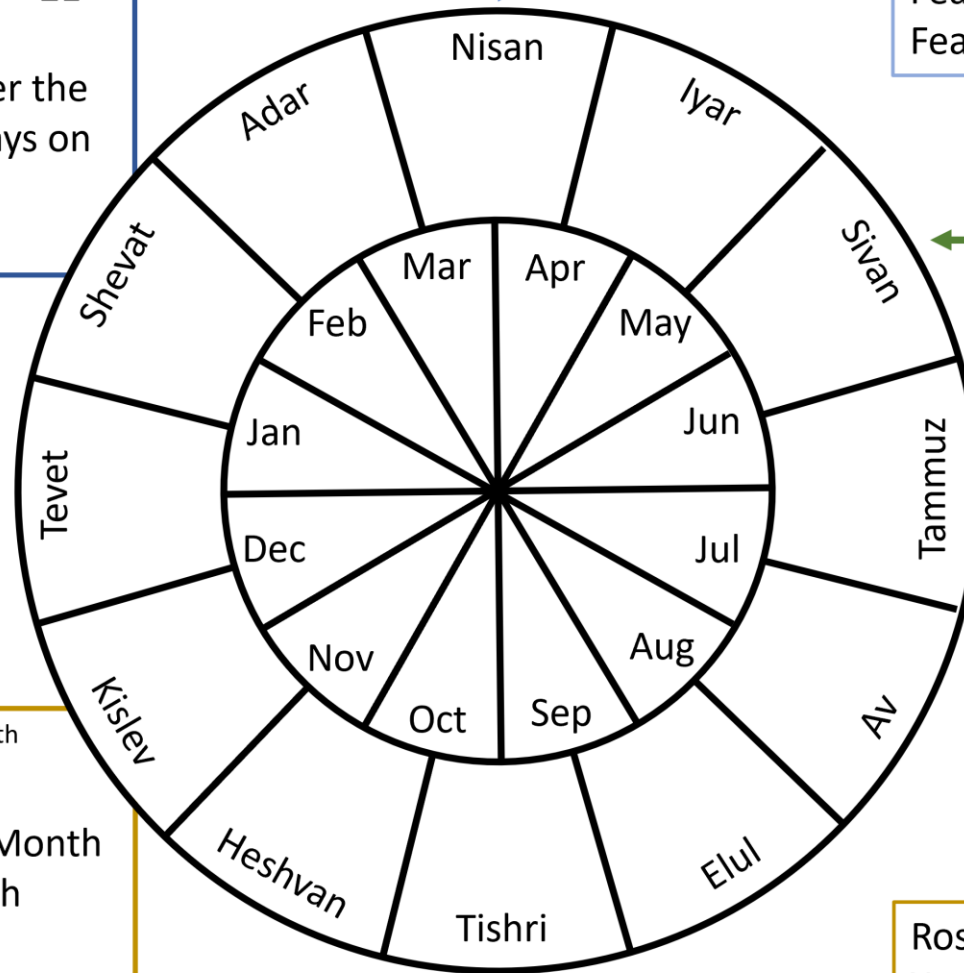

Pentecost
(Feast of Weeks)

Pentecost – Starting on the Feast of First Fruits as Day 1, count 7 Sabbath Days (Saturdays). That brings you to 49 days. The day after the last Sabbath is Pentecost, the 50th Day.
Leviticus 23:15-21

Rosh Hashanah – 1st Day of the 7th Month
Yom Kippur – 10th Day of the 7th Month
Sukkot – 15th Day of the 7th Month
Leviticus 23:23-32

Rosh Hashanah (Feast of Trumpets)
Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement)
Sukkot (Feast of Tabernacles)





Temple Timeline

586 BC TEMPLE #1 DESTROYED
The Babylonians destroy Jerusalem and the Temple II
Kings 25:6-11

535 BC TEMPLE #2
The Foundation is laid
Ezra 3:8-13
It was completed in 516 BC

70 AD The city of Jerusalem & the Temple are destroyed by Roman General Titus
Daniel 9:26, Matthew 24:1-2

1012 BC Foundation of TEMPLE #1 was laid. Completed in **1005 BC**
Solomon, the son of David, builds the 1st Temple

536 BC TEMPLE #2 The Altar is built in Jerusalem and sacrifices resume. (*Ezra 3:1-6*)

The Future TEMPLE #3 Built prior to the 70th week of Daniel. Could be built before or after the Rapture. (*Ezra 3:1-6*)

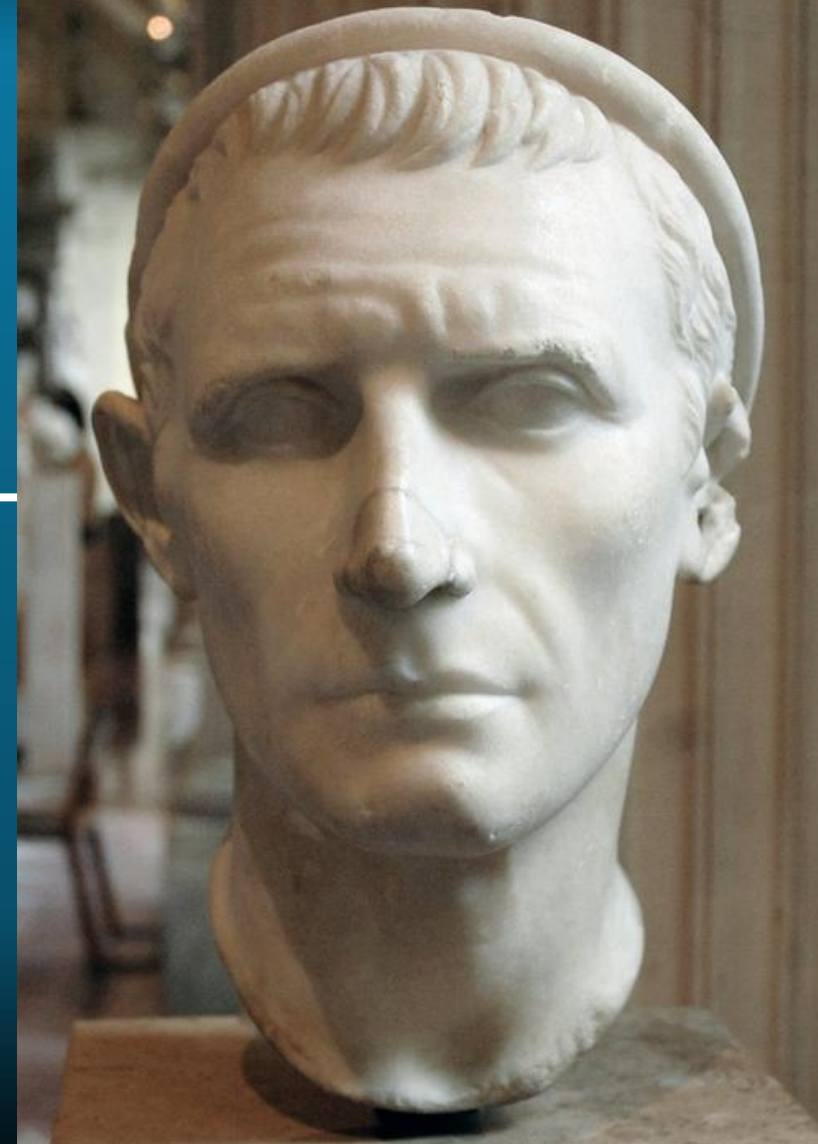

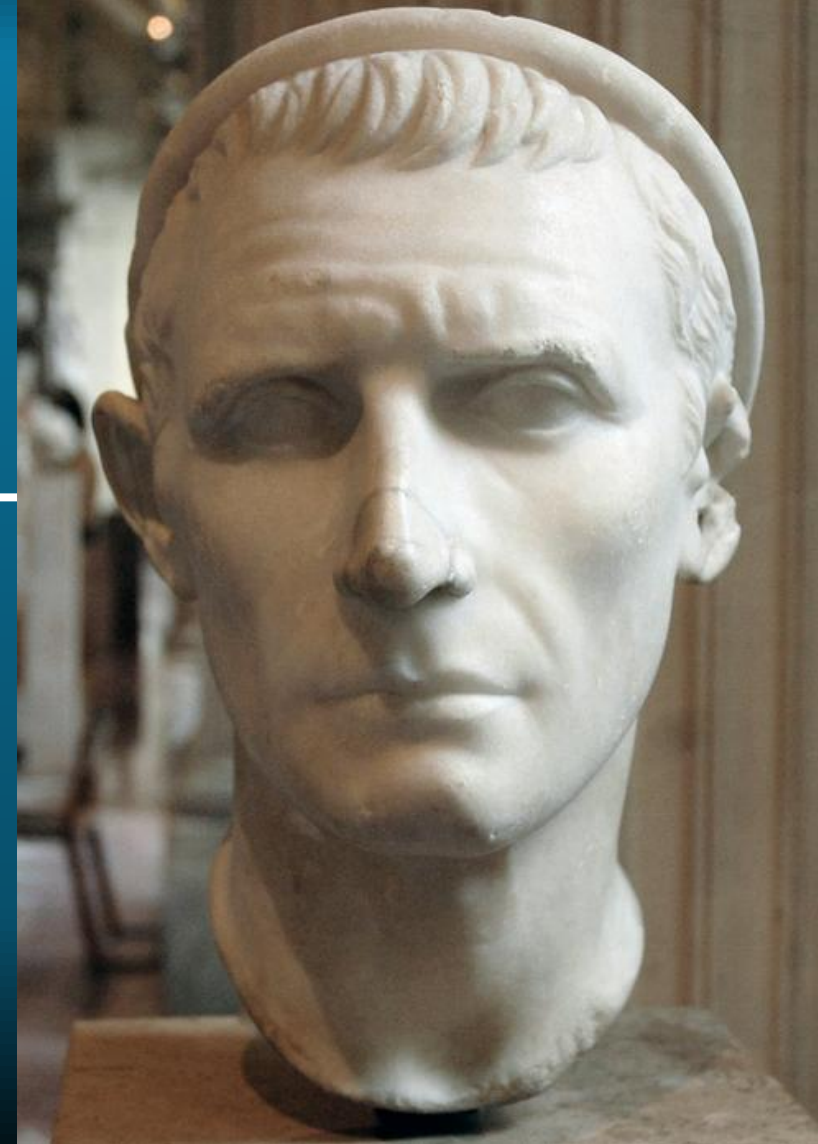
