Sanctification – the process of transforming into the likeness of Christ (Romans 8:29, II Corinthians 3:18, Colossians 3:10).

Glorification – Obtaining an immortal body, like Jesus, not made of flesh. Freed from the power of sin (I Corinthians 15:52-54, Philippians 3:21, I John 3:2).
