- Year totals 360 days

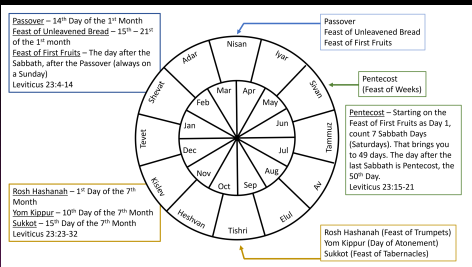


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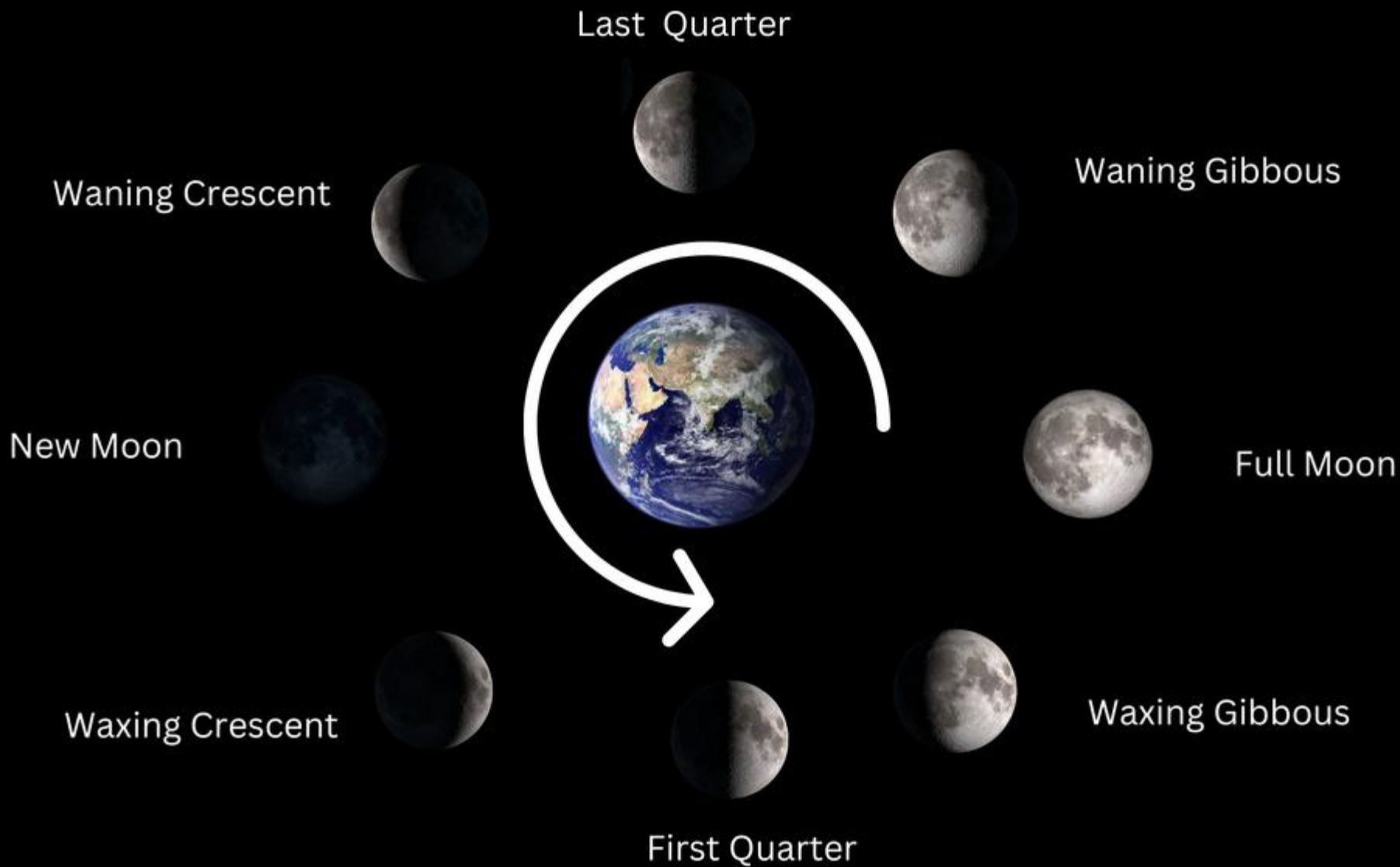

- The month is based on the lunar calendar which is 29 ½ days.



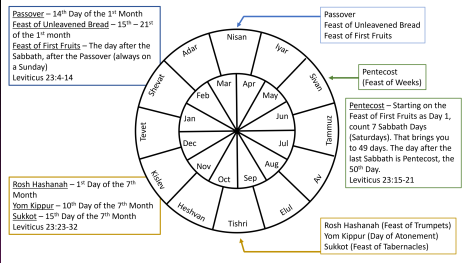
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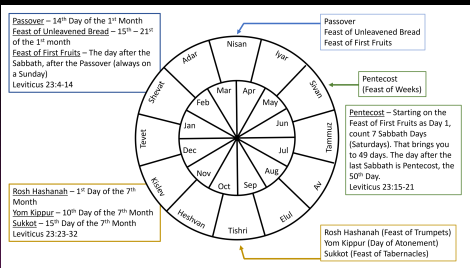
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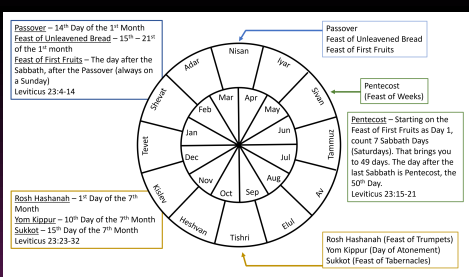


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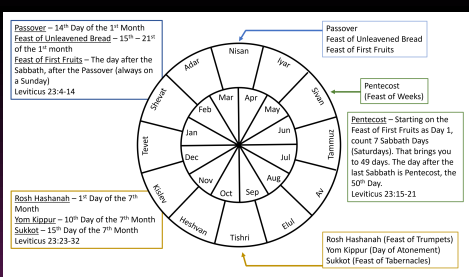
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- Days start at sundown, not at midnight.

Pentecost – Starting on the Feast of First Fruits as Day 1, count 7 Sabbath Days (Saturdays). That brings you to 49 days. The day after the last Sabbath is Pentecost, the 50th Day.

Rosh Hashanah Student Notes

This year it starts on Monday September 22nd at S.D. and it ends on Tuesday September 23rd at S.D. In the Bible, God teaches us through Moses that Rosh Hashanah is 1 day. However, many people around the world celebrate Rosh Hashanah for 2 days.

The Feast Days are Gods special days.

7 Feast Days in the Year (Holy Days)

3 in the Spring: Passover, Feast of Unleavened Bread and the Feast of First Fruits

1 in the Middle: Feast of Weeks [Shavuot (Pentecost)]

3 in the Fall: Feast of Trumpets (Rosh Hashanah), Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur), and the Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkot)

Adam and Eve were the first people God created on the 6th day.

- Rosh Hashanah is the anniversary of their creation.

THINGS TO DO 1: Read **Genesis 1:1-2:3**

- Read the creation account to your kids and explain that Rosh Hashanah is the anniversary of God creating Adam and Eve.

In the synagogues Genesis 21 is read on the first day of Rosh Hashanah. Genesis 22 is read on the 2nd day.

- Chapter 21 Issac is born. The birth of Issac was a miracle.
Ω The birth of Christ was a miracle.
- Chapter 22 Issac is sacrificed by his father.
Ω Christ was sacrificed by His Father.
✧ When Abraham was about to slay Isaac, an angel of the Lord came down and told him to stop.
✧ Abraham saw a ram caught in the thicket by his horns. This rams horn is now called a shofar. It is the trumpet used for Rosh Hashanah, the Feast of Trumpets.

THINGS TO DO 2: Read **Genesis 21**

- Teach your family why the birth of Isaac was a miracle. What promise do we learn about in Genesis 22?

THINGS TO DO 3: Read **Genesis 22**

- Explain how God asked Abraham to sacrifice Isaac. That is a picture of God the Father sacrificing His Son Jesus.

THINGS TO DO 4: BLOW THE SHOFAR – Shofar means a ram's horn trumpet.

- The kids LOVE blowing the Shofar!

THINGS TO DO 5: We can all perform this ceremony either corporately or as a family.

- A family will go to a moving body of water like a river.
 Ω A loaf of bread is pulled apart and each person takes a piece. We think about our sins, we confess our sins to God

and ask for forgiveness. We accept the forgiveness of God and we cast our bread into the water.

Teshuvah

"Teshuvah" basically means "Repentance,"

THINGS TO DO 6: Make a list of classmates, work colleagues, friends and family members that you might owe an apology.

- Talk to them and make amends.

THINGS TO DO 7: Teach our family about the 2nd coming of Christ and the Rapture that might take place on Rosh Hashanah.

THINGS TO DO 8: Light Candles.

Exodus 35:3 Ye shall kindle no fire throughout your habitations upon the sabbath day.

Shabbat Candles

Candles: Any Candle can be used.

- Lit in a place that can be seen by everyone.
- Women and girls light the candles.
 - Ω Single women and girls light one candle each.
 - Ω Married women light two. One for herself and one for her husband.

When: Candles are lit 18 minutes before sunset. After sunset, you may not light the candles. **Why not?**

After the candles are lit, the mother waves her hands three times over the flames, she covers her eyes and recites the blessing.
