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@ 3mph = 130 hours = 5.5 days without rest



Exodus Math

2M people, marching 2×2 = line of people
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A line of 100 people long, 20,000 people
wide could walk 20 miles in about 8-10
hours

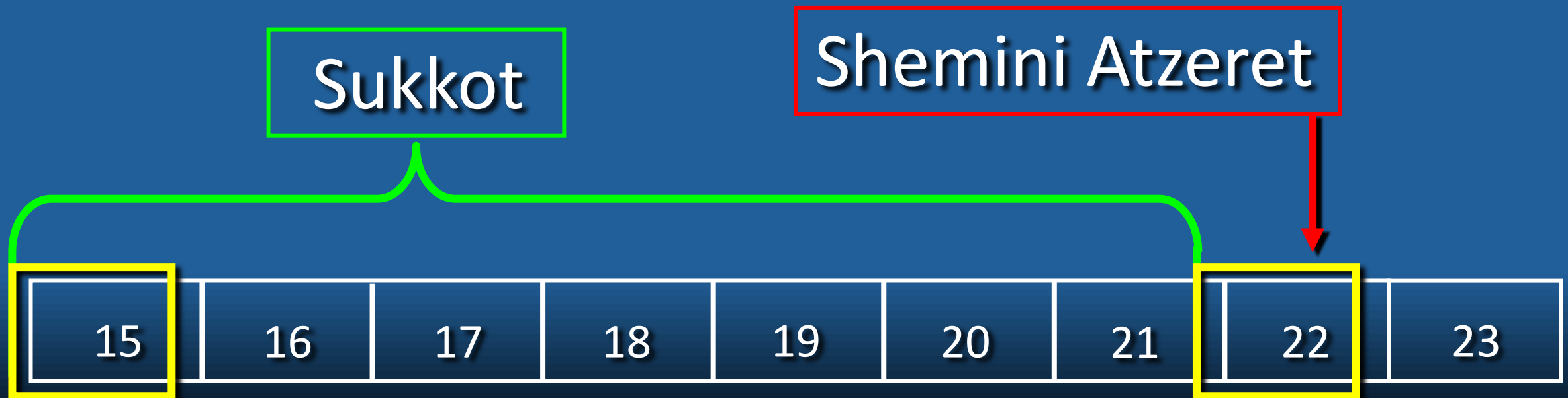

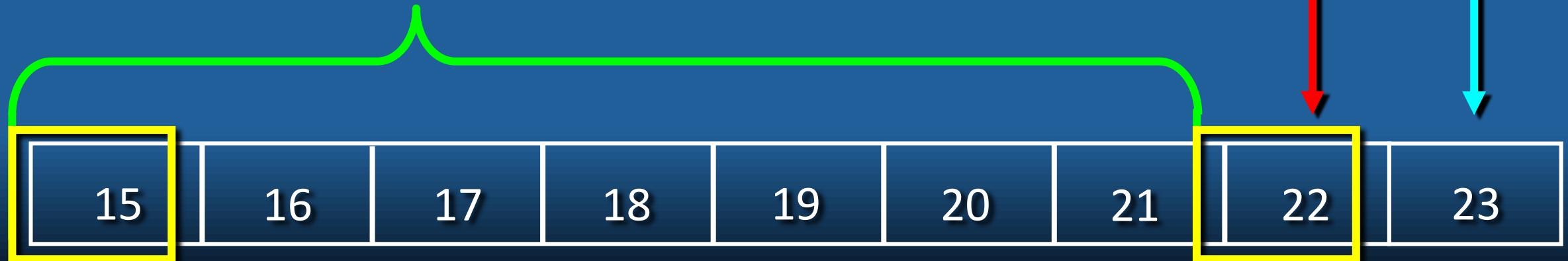
