Peace – An inner calm (John 14:27, John 16:33, Philippians 4:7, II Thessalonians 3:16, Romans 15:13)

But **the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost**, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you. 27 **Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you:** not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

32 For if ye love them which love you, what thank have ye? for sinners also love those that love them. 33 And if ye do good to them which do good to you, what thank have ye? for sinners also do even the same. 34 And if ye lend to them of whom ye hope to receive, what thank have ye? for sinners also lend to sinners, to receive as much again.

Glorification – Obtaining an immortal body, like Jesus, not made of flesh. Freed from the power of sin ([I Corinthians 15:52-54](#), [Philippians 3:21](#), [I John 3:2](#)).
