Roman Church – A Timeline

30 AD – The death and resurrection of Jesus,

Day of Pentecost – Jewish residents of Rome hear the Gospel message and take the Good News back to Rome. Small house churches form within the city's Jewish population

49 AD – Emperor Claudius expels the Jewish population from Rome, the church continues to grow with Gentile converts

54 AD – Edict is lifted upon Claudius's death.

Jews return to Rome; Jewish Christians return to the church.

57 AD – Paul writes to the Roman church from Corinth

58-60 AD – Paul returns to Jerusalem, is arrested in the temple, and is held in Caesarea. Exercised the right as a Roman citizen to have a trial in Rome

61 AD – Paul finally arrives in Rome and spends the first two years there, ministering while under house arrest

64 AD - Nero's great fire

64-67 AD – Peter and Paul martyred

70 AD – Fall of Jerusalem. The second temple was destroyed.

An explanation of what Jesus accomplished through His birth, life, death, and resurrection

Chapters 8-16: written by Paul, the pastor

- Chapter 8-11 – the reassurances we have in our salvation
8:1 Therefore, there is now no condemnation...
- Chapter 12-16 – how it should change us
12:1 Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice...
