The Cross & Tomb

Burden released

Three Shining Ones

- "Your sins are forgiven."
- Clothed him with a complete change of clothes
- Mark on forehead; scroll with a seal

Sleepers: Simple, Sloth, Presumption - sleeping

- Simple: no serious thought of spiritual realities
- Sloth: no resolve for spiritual pursuits
- Presumption: no careful consideration

Formalist and Hypocrisy from Vainglory

- Formalist: trust his ability to earn God's kingdom
- > Hypocrisy: trust his ability to deceive by pretense
- Climbed over the wall
- The real question...

Hill called Difficulty

- An intersection: Danger & Destruction
- a spring
- a resting place: scroll lost

Timorous & Mistrust

Palace Beautiful: ... for the relief and security of pilgrim The s...

- ~ the church as viewed by young Christian
 - > Watchful
 - Discretion, Prudence, Piety and Charity

Engage in godly conversation

Means of victory over "carnal annoyances":

- 1. Think and meditate on scene of the cross
- 2. Look at embroidered coat
- 3. Read/study the scroll
- 4. Warmly stimulated thoughts about the destination

What makes you so desirous to go to Mount Zion?

- 1. ...to see Him alive who hung dead on the cross
- 2. ...to be rid of all...that remain as an annoyance to me

Features of the Palace

Study: records of the greatest antiquity

- Bloodline of the Lord of the Hill; His deeds
- Deeds of His servants their "tools"

Armory: the Lord's provision for Pilgrims

- Artifacts used by saints
- Pilgrim equipped
