Pilgrim's Progress Stages 5 & 6: Faithful and Talkative Vanity Fair

Faithful

- ~ seen ahead, surpassed (last became first)
 - > Avenger of blood "close behind me"
 - Christian "felt proud"...stumbled and couldn't get up
 - > Faithful assists
- ~ picture of Christian companionship/conversation
 - > Shared pilgrimage stories: similarities & differences

Faithful's encounters:

Wanton sensual pleasure

~ Faithful's confession: I am not sure I entirely escaped her or not.

Adam the First the old man

- Burning thought: ...however he flattered...once he lured me into his house he would sell me as a slave
- Pursued/attacked by Moses secret fondness for Adam the First – no mercy found in the law - Rescued by the Lord

Villains in the Valley of Humiliation

~ Discontent, Shame (clingy...had a hard time shaking him...)

Talkative son of Say-well in Prating Row - wretched fellow

- ~ looks best from a distance...close up...quite ugly
- ~ religion has no place in his heart, or house or conversation
 - Talks about prayer...repentance...faith...the new birth, but he only knows how to talk about them

Evidences of saving grace in the heart:

- 1. Persuading the soul to abhor sin (not merely cry against it)
- 2. Evident to the person and to others one's reputation Faithful's piercing question: Is this true of you?

Stage 6

Evangelist

- ~ How have you fared...what have you encountered...how have you behaved yourselves?
- ~ rejoicing together, encouragements, cautions, counsel, reminders
- ~ at least one, to his advantage, will be killed in Vanity
 - 1. Arrive at the Celestial City sooner
 - 2. Escapes many miseries the other will meet

Vanity and the Fair

- ~ Origins: Beelzebub, Apollyon, Legion & associates
- ~ Nature: continuous fair on pilgrims' pathway
 - All manner of merchandise to appeal to the lust of the flesh, lust of the eyes, pride of life
 - > Round-the-clock entertainment/amusements
 - > Tailored to taste: Britain Row, French Row, Italian Row, etc.
- ~ visited by the Prince of Princes: Temptations

Christian/Faithful: clearly out of place

- ~ garments; speech; little value on the wares being sold
 - We buy the truth (Prov 23:23)
- \sim regarded as fools, lunatics, strange and unusual, madmen
 - Remained patient, non-retaliatory, offered blessing
 - Showed increased wisdom and meekness
 - their manner noticed by some
- \sim caged; death penalty sought; Faithful on trial boldness in truth

Judge: Lord Hate-good

Witnesses: Envy, Superstition, Pickthank

Jury: Blindman, No-good, Malice, Love-lust, Live-loose, Heady, High-mind, Enmity, Liar, Cruelty, Hate-light, Implacable

- ~ death by the cruelest method Faithful unto death [Rev 2:10]
 - taken by chariot on most direct route to Celestial Gate
