This message challenges us to reconsider what it means to build our spiritual lives on a firm foundation of truth. Drawing from Jesus' parable of the wise and foolish builders in Matthew 7, we're reminded that both houses looked complete and secure until the storm came. The difference wasn't in outward appearance or religious activity, but in what lay beneath the surface. When torrential rains and floods arrive in our lives, when grief strikes or circumstances overwhelm us, that's when the quality of our foundation is revealed. The question isn't whether we attend church regularly or volunteer faithfully, but whether we've built our understanding of who God is on the unchanging truth of Scripture. This message invites us to examine our own foundations and asks us to consider: when the storms of life come, will we hold tightly to God or drift away? The beauty of God's Word as our foundation is found in Hebrews 4:12, where Scripture is described not as a burden but as something alive and powerful, sharp enough to expose our innermost thoughts and desires. In a culture where truth shifts with opinions and circumstances, we're offered something solid and unchanging to stand on.

In what ways have you experienced rules or restrictions in your Christian walk as burdensome versus life-giving, and how has understanding God's heart behind them changed your perspective?

How can we distinguish between cultural or traditional church rules and biblical truth, and why is this distinction important for spiritual freedom?

How does the concept that 'salvation is not a reward for good things you have done' free you from striving to earn God's love, and how might this truth transform your relationship with Him?

The sermon warns against 'merely listening to the word' without doing what it says—what is one specific truth you've heard recently that you need to apply more intentionally in your life?

In what ways might you be 'drifting away' from truth due to inattention or laziness, and what steps can you take to move from spiritual stagnation toward maturity and growth?
