

Pronouncing Judgment | Micah 6:9-16 Rev. Dr. Russell St. John

1. Was the LORD obligated to warn Judah (again) of his impending judgment? How does this warning demonstrate his faithfulness?

2. What is wisdom, and why does the wise person fear the LORD?

3. How long had the people of Israel been heaping up treasures of wickedness though false weights and measures? What does it tell you about the LORD that he was so long-suffering with such consistent sin?

4. How would the integrity of the LORD suffer if he refused to judge the wicked?

5. How do deceptive gain, violence of every kind, and lying lips stand opposed to the very justice, steadfast love, and humility the LORD desires and commands?

6. Why are all of these acts instances of perfidy against the LORD? How do they represent both the statutes of Omri and the works of Ahab?

7. In what ways do you see such perfidy in your own heart and life?

8. Why must the LORD make "desolate" his people? What does his judgment accomplish?

9. How does his judgment represent and express his faithfulness to his Word?

10. Why was it important to bring to public light the moral nature of his people? To show visibly what was true of them internally?

11. What would happen if the LORD made visible your true nature?

12. Who will bear your reproach? Who will take your judgment?

13. How does this passage help you to rejoice in Christ's work for you?
