6. How do people reach a point of such animosity toward Jesus in the face of such overwhelming testimony?
7. How do Jesus' titles offer testimony?
8. How does the worship Jesus received offer testimony?
9. How had these religious leaders already broken the law in reference to John the Baptist?
10. What was chief concern of these religious leaders in answering Jesus question? Why does it make complete sense that they weren't concerned with the truth?
11. How could they have answered truthfully? How was the answer they gave clearly a lie?
12. How does this passage give you reason for overwhelming confidence in the authority of Jesus? In his kingship?
13. Who do you say that Jesus is?
