1. How does 1 Samuel 21:10-22:1 help you to understand Psalm 34?
2. How might you have misunderstood Psalm 34 without this historical background?
3. What does David do in verses 4-6? What is his primary activity?
4. Who is your “go-to” when you’re in a “tight spot?” Why?
5. In what sense was David not only “poor” but also afflicted? What is he confessing by describing himself as such?
6. We tend to think in terms of cause and effect, but David structures Psalm 34:1-7 in terms of effect and cause. Does this pattern hurt or help your understanding. How it is often more true to life?
7. Why does boasting in the LORD gladden the poor or afflicted?
8. Why does David stress magnifying and exulting the LORD “together” when his deliverance was personal? How must Christians participate in each other’s trials and triumphs?
