2. How can [Galatians 3:27](#) impact our heart for others?
3. Name a situation where you have seen the truth of [Galatians 3:28](#) lived out.
4. Why do you think the Samaritan acted the way he did in [Luke 10:33-36](#) considering the man he was helping was not friendly toward people of his ethnic background?
5. What can you do to have a heart and take action like the Samaritan in [Luke 10:33-36](#)?

MAKING IT PERSONAL

1. What does it mean for you to welcome people of different cultures into your life and not just tolerate them?
2. After this study, is there anything you have seen that calls you to action?
3. How can you better align your heart with God's for all people especially those different than yourself?
