BIG IDEA:

The seed of the gospel is small but grows huge, but only for a time.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 13:10-30



OPENING QUESTIONS

- 1. What are the worst directions you have ever received?
- 2. Have you ever tried to stop something from growing?

IN THE WORD

- 1. How does Luke 13:14-17 give us the context of these parables?
- 2. What do a mustard seed and yeast have in common as referenced in Luke 13:18-20?
- 3. Share some things the world believes are foolish, weak, or despised things as mentioned in 1 Corinthians 1:27-28. How can God use those for His kingdom.
- 4. The parable of the narrow door in Luke 13:24-27 appears negative. What do you see as the point of this parable?
- 5. How does Romans 10:9-10 fit into the parables of the mustard seed, yeast, and narrow door?

MAKING IT PERSONAL

- 1. How have you seen the kingdom of God grow like the mustard seed or yeast?
- 2. What are some small things in your life that have made a huge difference in your Christian walk?
- 3. Why is it important to plant small seeds of God's truth in people's lives? How do you do that?
- 4. Who is someone that does not seem to be growing despite your efforts to plant seeds of the Gospel?

CONTINUED LEARNING
