Being Unreligious

BIG IDEA: Being or doing? Religious people "do" and Jesus followers focus on "be."

TEACHING POINTS:

- Being unreligious like Jesus leads to an unexpected relationship.
- God blesses people who leave religion behind.
- God did not create the problem but He gives us the solution.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 5:1-12

OPENING QUESTIONS

1. What do you think when you hear someone say, "That person is religious"?

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2. Besides being at Pathway, what was the best part of Super Bowl Sunday?

IN THE WORD

- 1. Read Matthew 5:3-10 NLT.
 - Explain how each verse might upset the religious people of Jesus' day but give hope to most of the crowd.
 - Which verse gives you the most encouragement or hope?
 - Summarize the passage in one sentence for a person not of the Christian faith.
- 2. Explain why is it important to understand that Matthew 5:3-12 NLT is not about Jesus teaching religion, but relationship.
- 3. Where in our lives is it most important to apply the principle of 1 Corinthians 5:12-13a?

MAKING IT PERSONAL

- 1. Name some ways you can break the stereotype of what it means to be religious as a Christian.
- 2. Share about a time when you needed the hope that Jesus speaks about in the Beatitudes.
- 3. Who could you share with regarding the perspective you have gained about being unreligious from this study?

CONTINUED LEARNING

Luke 6:20-26 also lists the Beatitudes. Consider the negative warnings listed in the second half of this passage. What does that change about how we deal with people?
