2. Jesus and His disciples were supported by those they ministered to. The principle of ministers being supported by those they minister to is also taught in the New Testament (1 Tim 5:18; Gal 6:6). What are the implications of this principle for us today?
3. How do the misinterpretations of this passage emphasize the importance of using proper Bible interpretation principles when reading or studying the Bible?
4. In the final night Jesus spent with his disciples before the crucifixion, He demonstrates exemplary others-mindedness in preparing them for his departure from them. How can we learn from Jesus’ example and grow and others-mindedness in our own lives?
