The government of Ecuador was trying to win the hearts of the people over the leftist communists that were a constant threat. A security detachment went with the medical team daily for protection. Fred said he ate MRE's and drank warm orange Mountain Dew the whole time. He was honorably discharged in August, 1994 as a Captain.

Fred has also spent 2 additional years at Loyola Medical School to gain expertise in the sub-specialty field of infectious diseases. He has been practicing in Joliet for the last 35 years, the first 10 in internal medicine and infectious diseases and the last 25 years in infectious diseases only. In Joliet in 1987 there were two part-time doctors in that field and today there are 7 full-time doctors and 3 nurse practitioners.

Over the years Fred has led 8 medical and surgical mission teams to Bolivia, each for 10 - 14 days and the one to Tijuana, Mexico in 2022.

Fred and Beth were both founding board members of Trinity Christian School in Shorewood and Fred is still the president of that board. He is also president of the Cup of Cold Water board. They were blessed with 4 'kids' and 5 grandsons, 3 of which have been born in the last 6 months.

His life in Christ began at Loyola when he attended a charismatic prayer group where he made a solid commitment to Jesus Christ as his Savior.



Ron Shepherd

Ron Shepherd was born in 1938 and grew up in Portsmouth, Ohio, the Rov hometown o f Rogers. Starting about age 10 to age 15 he was a caddy at the local golf course and fell in love with the sport. He attended Portsmouth West High School and graduated in 1956. Detroit Steel was the major industry town. Immediately after graduation he began work at the Northfork Railroad in town.

In 1961 at age 23 he was drafted into the United States Army. He had been married in 1959 and he would have two daughters. That marriage ended in divorce in 1978. His basic training was at Ft. Knox in Kentucky and then on to Ft. Hood in Texas. Ron was only there for 3 - 4 days and then sent back to Ft. Knox for training as a radio mechanic for 13 weeks. From there back to Ft. Hood as part of the 1st and 2nd Armored Divisions. His main responsibility was a gunner on the M-48 tank. He spent the rest of his two year commitment there except for 2 - 3 weeks in October, 1962 when he was sent to Ft. Stewart in Georgia during the Cuban Missile Crisis under President John F. Kennedy.

Ron was honorably discharged on October 22, 1963 with the rank of E-5.

He was the recipient of badges for good conduct, and sharpshooter for pistol and rifle. He was in the Army Reserves for four years.

Upon returning to Portsmouth, Ohio he went back to his railroad job, but was laid off after a couple of vears in 1966. He was hired by General Mills in Lancaster, Ohio and worked there for 6 years and then transferred to their plant in West Chicago, IL After working at General Mills for 33 years Ron retired in 1999. Earlier, Ron had married his second wife, Ruth in 1983 and after his retirement they moved to Branson, Missouri. In November of 2019 because of her declining health they moved to Yorkville to live with his daughter and son-in-law, Mike and Julie Angelo. Ruth went to be with the Lord in March, 2020. Ron has been attending Helmar for two years - loves the hymns and teaching! In his testimony he said he came to Christ in 1983 at the age of 45.



Fred Alexander

Fred was born in Chicago, IL on November 7, 1956. He was the 2nd of 9 children and his mother is still living at age 98. He attended Schaumburg High School and graduated in 1974, then on to Loyola University majoring in chemistry. After graduation in 1978 he decided to pursue a career in medicine and began at the Abraham Lincoln School of Medicine (currently University of Illinois at

Chicago Medical) While there he met Beth Kittelson and they were married on December 20, 1980. After graduating from Lincoln Medical in June, 1982 Fred and Beth moved on to the Lutheran General Hospital Residency program for the next three years.

Beth was a pediatric doctor and Fred was an internal medicine physician.

While at Lutheran General Fred joined the National Guard for a 10 year commitment in 1984. The government was desperate for doctors so he wasn't required to attend the two week summer training program or the once a month instruction. His actual service time was a 16 day medical mission trip to Ecuador. A complete medical hospital team of 120 left National Guard Base at O'Hare as part of 108th Medical Support Battalion in July, 1985. The 108th is out of the National Guard Armory in Humboldt Park. They flew in a C-130 Hercules and served
