REMEMBER

Frequently in the Old Testament, the Lord tells His people to "remember." We must be told again and again to remember because we are quick to forget. Looking into the unknown of the future can easily lead to uncertainty, fear, and discouragement. Remembering the track record of God's faithfulness in the past builds faith in our hearts. The God who has been faithful in the past is the same God who promises to be faithful in the future. Psalm 143:5 says, "I remember the days of old; I meditate on all you have done; I ponder the work of your hands."


When I started working at the Bible College this past summer, I had a lot of worry and uncertainty. I was tasked with developing an intentional discipleship structure for the students on campus. How will the students respond? Will I find people who are willing to invest in the students? Will the students catch a vision for making disciples after they leave FLBC? When I found myself worrying, I remembered this concept and took time to "remember the days of old; . . . the work of your hands." God had called me here. He has a plan, and I will get a front-row seat to watch it take shape. His track record in my past can be trusted for my future.

God was indeed faithful. Forty-four leaders said yes to leading a small discipleship group with two or three students. Many of the students were initially resistant to "one more thing" added to an already challenging and busy schedule. However, as they spent time in their groups studying God's word, praying for one another, and sharing the joys and struggles of life, many of them began to look forward to their "d-group" time each week. For some, they have expressed that it is a high point for their week. God has indeed been faithful.

I can think about the future and wonder, Will the students take their d-group experiences here and share them with a lost and dying world? I can worry about that, or I can look back on this past year and "ponder the work of his hands." There is always something in the future to worry about, but there are also plenty of things in the past that help us remember that we don't have to worry. "I remember the days of old; I meditate on all that you have done; I ponder the work of your hands."
