January 25, 2026

I recently saw a video of a Catholic priest at a funeral who, unexpectedly, burst into singing “Goodness of God.” The chorus sings, “And all my life You have been so, so good, With every breath that I am able, I will sing of the goodness of God.” It struck me for two reasons. Firstly, because it was a beautiful pastoral moment that reminded a grieving congregation of God’s faithfulness. But then I also realized these are the very words the dead man would wish to sing if he were able. Except that he had no more breath. He was unable.

Psalm 104:33a sings, “I will sing to the Lord as long as I live.” It is easy to sing when we have health, comfort, and our loved ones nearby. But what about when we have only some or even none of that? Our grieving, faltering voice fails to find itself, and we forget how to sing. In those moments, all we can do is be reminded of the goodness and the faithfulness of God. Psalm 104 is a “go-to” Scripture for the creative and providential power of God. Take a moment and read this Psalm. It describes how our Lord established the very foundations of the world; giving water, food, and even breath to all living things. By His Word alone, He created out of nothing. Out of His fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, He richly and daily provides you with all that you need. If it is hard to find your voice, if you feel the sting of loss, if you are suffering, hear the Word of our Lord in Psalm 104. The same Word that made the heavens and the earth out of nothing and sustains them, spoke faith out of nothing into your heart and sustains it today. Receive His faithfulness, and let it kindle a faltering, stammering tongue to sing.

Even greater, let us not forget that our Lord Jesus often prayed the Psalms during His life (and death, see Psalm 22). Dietrich Bonhoeffer reminds us in *The Prayerbook of Christ* that we can read each Psalm as a prayer offered by the Great High Priest Jesus to our Heavenly Father. So, when we come to die, as each of us will, we can take heart that our High Priest does not forget us. Instead, as we lie in death’s bed, Jesus raises His voice when ours has finally failed. Jesus sings for us to our Father hymns of praise and glory. He sings us awake unto eternal life.
