Paul, in this text, encourages believers to live as different people. He presents here a general exhortation. As the letter goes on, he will get rather specific about what it means to live as new creations of God. However, today we seek to answer the question: "How then shall we live?"

"I am the light of the world."

John 8:12b

"I am the light of the world" (John 8:12). As Christians we know this phrase well. We also know the rest of verse 12, "Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (NIV). I love this verse in John's gospel as we see the message of the verse in our everyday life.

A 5-watt nightlight provides security for everyone in my home not to walk in darkness in the middle of the night. The headlamp I wear when hiking allows me not to walk in darkness and safely see my path. Streetlights allow me to not walk in darkness to my neighbor's house and return home. And, of course, we are bathed in light from the sun during the day and light from the moon at night. Light is everywhere in our daily life, and it is good.

As I was preparing this devotion based on John 8:12, I was reminded of a news story I recently read about the Saudi Arabian government installing solar powered laser lights in the desert to guide lost travelers to water at night. This effort to provide a lifesaving light in the dark of night to guide people to a lifesaving source of water is a direct parallel to what our Savior does for us. As we are taught throughout Scripture, He is *the light of the world* (John 8:12), He brings us out of darkness (Colossians 1:13), He brings us to the water of life where we will thirst no longer (John 4:14).

Jesus has an eternal promise for His light for us as well. In Revelation, John writes in relation to the New Jerusalem on the New Earth, "The city does not need the sun or the moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and the Lamb is its lamp." How glorious! Our Savior will dwell among us and provide us light for eternity! Amen, come, Lord Jesus!

As you go about your week, I hope and pray that you will see your Savior every time you see light in the world. He has promised to always go with you. Light is evidence of His promise to you, for He is *the light of the world*.
