

HIS ONLY SON

In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only son into the world, so that we might live through him.

1 John 4:9

Will you gaze this Christmas into the manger at God's only Son? We look with wonder, because of the identity of the only Son.

John 1:14 puts it this way. "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." Jesus is God's Word in the flesh. He is the promised picture of the Old Testament tabernacle, setting up His dwelling with people. This Child is full of God's grace. Jesus is not simply someone with truth, but rather, He Himself is eternal truth.

We also look with wonder, because of the importance of the only Son. Scripture has a steady thread about significant individuals who were an "only son." Three times in Genesis 22, Isaac is referenced as the only son. In the prophets, Jeremiah and Amos point to the kind of heart-wrenching grief that accompanies the loss of an only son. Foreshadowing His own resurrection, Jesus raised the only son of a widow in Luke 7.

We finally look with wonder, because of the invitation of the only Son. Christmas compels us to receive the only Son. "Only" is powerful. It signifies the authority of Jesus. "Only" declares that there is no other. It reminds us the Baby in the manger is the sole Savior of the world. "Only" is exclusive in that there is no substitute for His substitutionary death. While our globe continues to clamor for other ways to earn salvation, consistently ignoring God's provision in Christ, the Lord God Almighty declared Jesus to be His beloved Son. "Only" communicates this importance. The early church stressed the fact in Acts 4:12. "And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

The "only Son" came to deliver your soul and mine. Jesus' life would lead to His death and His resurrection. When we say, "Merry Christmas," we declare the only Son of God has come for us. Let us live through Him!
