I'm overwhelmed by the sordid reality of being human. Stories about lunatics shooting senators jolt me, but more often I recoil at the ubiquity of my petty and judgmental thoughts, my desperation for approval, my obsession with fulfilling my desires.

When I look hard at myself and don't squint, I'm afraid. My self-centeredness pollutes my life and the lives around me, as insidious in its long-term effects as any number of occasional, flagrant sins. I think, *If this is what I'm like, even when I love God and my family, then what is the point?* I will never reach my aspirations for a meaningful life, nor will my standards ever be high enough. Ecclesiastes is right: "All the toil of a man is for his mouth, yet his appetite is not satisfied" (6:7).

If I'm honest, I desire Christianity to assuage my discomfort with myself. I want God to make me a better person so I have less to be ashamed of. I long to have wisdom in order to know I am wise. I'm desperate to feel that nothing I do is chasing after wind.

What comforts me in desperation is not a wind that makes me deaf to my clamoring questions, nor an earthquake that shakes me to my senses, nor a fire that illumines all my meaningful actions or covers my trail of wrong ones. It's the still, small voice of God made human. Jesus knew how pitiful people are; then He became one of us.

Our search for meaning and our longing to be at peace with ourselves are not satisfied by what Jesus produces in us, but by Jesus. "[In him] are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge," says Colossians, and later, "You have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God" (2:3; 3:3). Jesus does not throw us the treasures of wisdom and life from a distance. They are in Him. We cannot get them unless we enter Christ through His death, and when we enter, we are raised in the truth that "Christ . . . is [our] life" and "became to us wisdom from God" (Colossians 3:4; 1 Corinthians 1:30).

Our lives, even as Christians, comprise daily stabs at meaning and peace, followed by failure, pride, exhaustion, and despair. "But when Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory" (Colossians 3:3). Our existence is a journey into the wisdom, life, and meaning that is the incarnate Christ. Only He can be everything, and only in Him can it all hold together (Colossians 1:17).
