THE LORD—HE IS GOD IN HEAVEN ABOVE

With God's deliverance fresh in their minds, the Israelites were preparing to enter the Promised Land. They'd seen the Red Sea's tide stopped, ate the manna provided daily, and learned to trust His leading through cloud and fire. As the land of milk and honey awaited, God's people received His call to obedience and His warning against idolatry: "Know therefore today, and lay it to your heart, that the Lord is God in heaven above and on earth beneath; there is no other" (Deuteronomy 4:39).

Our modern ears might find that statement a bit startling. In our culture today, we are encouraged to find our own realities and determine our own individual theologies of who God is to us. But from the beginning, God has been clear with us about what is true. "Know therefore . . ." invites us to find confidence in what is objective and real. God's words through Moses continue with the connection from our minds to our hearts: "lay it on your heart." God wants us to not only know Him, but to experience His love! Our Creator and Redeemer, Jesus Christ, makes our relationship with Him clear to us. He calls us in covenant relationship to Him, and Him alone!


Knowing the battle that awaited the Israelites—not just the conquest of Canaan but the battle against idolatry—God directed them to the truth that would sustain them. He knew their hearts would be tempted to look to something apart from Him. "So it is with all idolatry. For it happens not merely by erecting an image and worshipping it, but rather it happens in the heart. For the heart stands gaping at something else. It seeks help and consolation from creatures, saints, or devils" (Luther's Large Catechism).

While it seems mind-boggling that the Israelites forgot the amazing work of God among them, the same can happen in our congregations today. Even as we seek to plant new churches, encourage growth, and navigate through struggles in our congregations, we can be tempted to depend on our own effort or success. In times of trial and discouragement, we may doubt His power and goodness, the truth that "there is no other" (Deuteronomy 4:39). As helpful as growth strategies and programs may be, when we depend on those more than Christ and His work, they become idols.

As our congregations enter a new season this fall, we can declare confidently that the Lord is God. There is no other. Let's look to Him and depend on His power to continue to build His Church.
