October 26, 2025 "A Magnificent Ministry" Colossians 1:24-29

Paul has been teaching us about the supremacy of Jesus Christ in Colossians 1. In recent sermons, we have considered Jesus' pre-eminence in creation (vv. 15-17), in the church (v. 18), and in reconciliation (vv. 19-23). Now Paul gives us a view of his ministry of proclaiming the majesty of Christ. Paul's ministry was, indeed, magnificent.

A LIVING REFORMATION

As we celebrate Reformation Day, we do more than look back—we look up. We remember how God, in His mercy, raised up Martin Luther and the Reformers to call the Church back to the unshakable foundation of His Word. At the heart of that Reformation cry was a rediscovery of the Gospel: that we are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone. It was not human achievement, but divine mercy and grace!

And the miracle is God has not stopped reforming His Church. The same Holy Spirit who opened Luther's eyes to the truth of Scripture is still at work today, reforming hearts and renewing lives through the Gospel.

The Apostle Paul wrote that "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.' How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? . . . So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ" (Romans 10:13–15, 17).

This is more than a mission strategy, it's a holy reality: God builds His Church through the preaching of His Word. The message is His, and the power is His. And so we take heart because the pressure is not on us to change hearts, only to faithfully proclaim the One who does.

That's why ministries like AFLC Home Missions matter so deeply. Rooted in the Reformation's convictions, Home Missions seeks to plant and nurture new Lutheran congregations across the United States, each one built not on trends or techniques, but on the living Word of God. Whether in rural farm towns, bustling suburbs, or multicultural cities, the mission remains the same: to bring Jesus to the lost, the hurting, and the hungry.

The local congregation, Luther taught, is the heartbeat of the Church—and that heartbeat continues through Home Missions. When a church is planted, it's not about a building—it's about Christ being formed in people. It's about babies brought to the waters of baptism. It's about sinners hearing words of absolution. It's about bread and wine becoming the means through which Christ gives Himself to His people. It's about lives changed by the Gospel.

This Reformation Day, let your heart be stirred. The Church is not just a monument to the past; it is a movement of the present. The Reformation was not a one-time event, but an ongoing work of the Spirit to conform the Church ever more fully to the Word of God. And through Home Missions, we see that reformation happening today—one church plant, one sermon, one soul at a time.

So let us pray, let us give, let us encourage, and let us go. And let us rejoice that God is still reforming His Church, not through force or fame, but through His faithful, living, powerful Word.
