Worship the Creator of Heaven, Earth, and Sea

January often brings the chill of winter, settling in with frosty mornings and bare landscapes. Yet it's also a season of fresh starts—a new year brimming with possibilities, plans, and the quiet anticipation of spring's arrival. Soon the world will awaken with vibrant grass, blooming flowers, and leaves painting the earth in colors crafted by our Creator. One of my great joys is hearing the cheerful songs of birds returning in the warmer months, a reminder of the life and beauty God has woven into the world.

Scripture clearly reveals the source of all creation: “In the beginning God created” (Genesis 1:1). This foundational truth brings clarity and purpose to everything else in the Bible. Consider the staggering diversity of life—estimates suggest up to 100 million unique species, from animals and plants to fungi and bacteria. The complexity and variety of life defy the notion of random evolution, a theory that persists despite its scientific shortcomings. The truth is far simpler and more profound: every element of the heavens, earth, and sea is the masterful work of our Lord.

The Bible beautifully captures this in Psalm 19:1-4: *“The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge. They have no speech, they use no words; no sound is heard from them. Yet their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world.”*

These words resonate deeply. When I stand under a country sky, far from city lights, the stars shine with a brilliance that stirs awe in my soul. Their silent majesty speaks of God's boundless power. Similarly, in the warmth of summer, sitting in my backyard surrounded by towering trees, rustling bushes, chirping birds, and fluttering butterflies, I'm overwhelmed by the creativity and beauty of our Creator. These moments echo the truth of Romans 1:20: *“For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse.”*

We are without excuse. Creation itself testifies to God's glory, inviting us to worship the One who made it all. Let's pause to marvel at His handiwork and give Him the praise He deserves.
