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His tender mercies are over all his works. Psalm 145:9

After staying in the United States for eight years, I have found that we take for granted the so-called comfort brought by freedom and material abundance, and we seldom recall God's mercy and protection in the days of oppression and shortage. Sometimes our complaints about people, things, circumstances, and even God, are far more true expressions of our inner feelings than our confession and praise! When we give thanks to God, do we only thank Him as the Creator of the world or only remember that He is the provider of our daily bread? When God does not respond to us immediately like Aladdin's genie, our faith may begin to shake and we may question God's love—"I am in so much trouble, where are you God?" We tend to forget that He is the one who is "slow to anger and rich in love. He does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities" (Psalm 103:10). He is not only the creator/provider, but also our SAVIOR! (Romans 4:17).

When we complain about people, things, or circumstances, we forget that His mercy is over all that He has made (Psalm 145:9). We, too, were once outsiders, and it was through the precious blood of Jesus Christ that we now are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God (Ephesians 2:11-19). Our sins are washed away! But we forget God's love and compassion are not anything like our self-centered love. His love is over all His works. "For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust" (Matthew 5:45). Can we say that we are God's work only, but that other people, animals, flowers, and trees, they are not?

Our righteous Father hates sin, but He loves us, the sinners! John 3:16 clearly reminds us, "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life!" God does not exclude anyone from His offer of grace and mercy. He does not want anyone to perish. Rather, sinners who exclude God from their lives cause their own perishing. As a parent of three little ones, I am feeling deeply about this. We know our merciful heavenly Father will never want His children to walk to destruction. Praise Him for His tender mercies!
