January 4, 2026

Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him. Psalm 37:7a

In this busy and hectic world in which we live, it seems difficult to find time to just be "still before the Lord." When we wake up in the morning, our minds are often on the responsibilities of the day. We feel rushed, short on time, and we want to get going on what we have planned for the day ahead. Sometimes our tasks take precedence over our daily devotional time. But the growth of our walk with the Lord depends on our spending time with Him.

We are often like the disciples who at times let worry and fear get them all out of sorts. Jesus said to them in Mark 6:31, "Come with me to a quiet place and get some rest." That's good advice for all of us, especially to spend some time each day alone with Him. These moments of stillness with the Lord are the source of strength and confidence in Him as we face our day.

Quiet time has many spiritual, as well as emotional and physical, benefits:

- It is a time to remember and reflect on God's goodness and give us an appreciation for His work in our lives. "Great are the works of the Lord; they are pondered by all who delight in them" (Psalm 111:2).
- It is a time to listen for God's voice and look for His direction in our life. "Whether you turn to the right or to the left, your ears will hear a voice behind you, saying, 'This is the way; walk in it'" (Isaiah 30:21).
- It is a time to meditate on God's Word, to let His Word sink into our heart and mind. "Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful" (Joshua 1:8).
- It is a time to quiet our heart, putting our faith and trust in God. He can free us from fear and anxiety. "But I have calmed and quieted my soul, like a weaned child with its mother; like a weaned child is my soul within me" (Psalm 131:2).

Let us not neglect our time alone with Him and rest in the promise of Psalm 91:1: "Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty!"
