Part 9 – God Doesn't Waste a Hurt Pastor Tom Kang

- I) Spend a moment to reflect on this past year of quarantine.

- 4) In what ways might you benefit from the discipline of "calming and quieting yourself" as the psalmist describes in verse 2?
- 5) Where do you think the psalmist's resilience to put his "hope in the Lord both now and forevermore" (v.3) comes from?
- 6) How does this psalm resonate with you personally? Take time to pray for one another.
